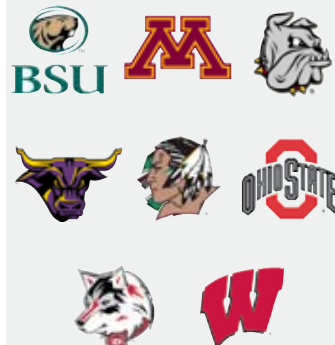

# Four Final Regular Season WCHA Series Feb. 18-19 to Determine Five Playoff Positions, Three First Round Playoff Match Ups; WCHA Champion UW at MSU, UM at UND, SCSU at UMD, OSU at BSU Battle for Second Place Between Minnesota, Minnesota Duluth; Badgers, Golden Gophers, Bulldogs, Sioux to Host First Round Playoff Series Feb. 25-27; Wisconsin Extends Unbeaten Streak to 18 Games with Sweep of UND; UM, UMD Gain Feb. 11-12 Sweeps; St. Cloud State Splits with MSU to Notch First Win; WCHA's Non-Conference Record at 24-11-3 (.671); Four WCHA-Member Teams Again Ranked Among Nation's Top 10 in Latest USCHO.com Div. 1 Poll ... UW No. 1, UM No. 3, UMD No. 6, UND No. 8; Tickets Available for 2011 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF, Set for March 4-5 at Ridder Arena in Minneapolis

MADISON, Wis. – While top-ranked and league champion Wisconsin flexed its muscle again last weekend (Feb. 11-13) and ran its unbeaten streak to 18 games with a pair of impressive victories over eighth-ranked North Dakota at the Kohl Center, two teams – Minnesota and defending national champion Minnesota Duluth – still have hopes of finishing in second place as the women's Western Collegiate Hockey Association heads into its final weekend of play prior to the post-season.

With two games left in the 2010-11 regular season, Wisconsin nailed down the top seed for the WCHA playoffs, which open with a best-of-three, on-campus series Feb. 25-27, and will host No. 8 seed St. Cloud State. Bemidji State is also assured of the No. 5 seed. Every other seed is up for grabs, although Minnesota, Minnesota Duluth and North Dakota have clinched home ice for the playoffs.

The final regular season weekend of Feb. 18-19 will again feature a full slate of four WCHA series. No. 1-ranked Wisconsin (28-2-2, 22-2-2 WCHA) will play at Minnesota State (8-21-3, 7-18-1-0 WCHA) and All Seasons Arena

at 7:07 pm CT on Friday and 3:07 pm CT on Saturday. In the first series of the season between the Badgers and the Mavericks, Wisconsin won 3-2 and 6-1 in Madison on Oct. 29-30.

Second place and No. 3-ranked Minnesota (22-7-2, 17-7-2-1 WCHA) will hit the road to take on fourth place and No. 8-ranked North Dakota (17-10-3, 15-9-2-0 WCHA) at Ralph Engelstad Arena on Friday and Saturday at 7:07 pm CT. The Sioux swept the Golden Gophers in Minneapolis back on Oct. 15-16 by 4-3 and 3-1 scores.

Third place and No. 6-ranked Minnesota Duluth (18-7-3, 16-7-3-0 WCHA) will conclude their regular season at new AMSOIL Arena against St. Cloud State (1-29-1, 1-24-1-1 WCHA), with Friday and Saturday evening face-offs at 7:07 pm CT. In their first head-to-head match up on Dec. 3-4 in St. Cloud, the two teams tied 2-2 (ot) in game one (SCSU won shootout 1-0) before the Bulldogs skated away with a 5-0 triumph in game two.

And up at the new Sanford Center in Bemidji, fifth place Bemidji State (12-15-3, 10-13-3-2 WCHA) will play host to sixth place Ohio State (14-16-2, 8-16-2-2 WCHA) in Friday and Saturday afternoon matinees at 2:07 pm CT. In Columbus back on Nov. 26-27, the host Buckeyes and Beavers tied 2-2 (ot) in the opener (OSU won shootout 1-0) before Ohio State claimed a 3-1 triumph in game two.

Last weekend (Feb. 11-13), St. Cloud State won its first game of the season and grabbed a series split against Minnesota State in its final home series. Senior netminder Ashley Nixon made 23 saves and freshman forward Molli Mott and sophomore forward Alex Nelson scored goals to lead the Huskies to last Friday's 2-0 win against MSU at the National Hockey Center. But after being shutout for three straight games, the Mavericks came back to take a 3-1 win last Saturday as Lisa Edman, Kathleen Rogan and Tracy McCann scored goals and goalie Alli Altman made 30 saves.

In Minneapolis, Minnesota ran its record to 12-1-2 since early December by sweeping Bemidji State at Ridder Arena. Jen Schoullis had two goals last Friday to spark a four-goal first period which keyed a 4-1 victory. On Saturday, sophomore goaltender Noora Rätty made 34 saves for her ninth shutout of the season to set a single-season shutout school record as the Golden Gophers defeated the Beavers, 3-0.

In Madison, Wisconsin received three goals from Meghan Duggan and two from Hilary Knight and took a 5-0 victory over North Dakota in the series opener on Feb. 11. Then last Sunday, Duggan scored two more goals, including her 30th of the season, and Knight added her 39th goal of the year as the Badgers remained unbeaten since Thanksgiving weekend with an 8-4 victory over the Sioux. The Badgers are 16-0-2 in their unbeaten streak.

And in Columbus, Minnesota Duluth jumped into third place with two road wins at Ohio State. Senior forward Elin Holmlov scored two goals and added an assist and sophomore forward Jessica Wong registered three assists as the Bulldogs defeated the Buckeyes, 5-2, last Friday at the OSU Ice Rink. The Bulldogs then completed the sweep with a 5-1 victory last Saturday when defenseman Jocelyne Larocque had a goal and three assists and became the first UMD defenseman to ever score 100 points.

Wisconsin, Minnesota, North Dakota and Minnesota Duluth have clinched home ice with a finish in the top four and will host first round, on-campus playoff series Feb. 25, 26 and 27 (if necessary).

The winners of those four best-of-three series all advance to the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF, set for March 4-5 at Ridder Arena in Minneapolis.

Wisconsin has clinched 1st place, will be the No. 1 seed and play the No. 8 seed St. Cloud State.

Minnesota could finish 2nd or 3rd in the final regular season standings, and will be either the No. 2 or No. 3 seed for the playoffs.

Minnesota Duluth could finish second, third or fourth, and will be the No. 2, No. 3 or No. 4 playoff seed.

North Dakota could finish third or fourth, and will be either the No. 3 or No. 4 playoff seed.

Bemidji State will finish in 5th place and will be the No. 5 playoff seed.

Ohio State could finish in sixth or seventh place, and will be either the No. 6 or No. 7 playoff seed. OSU and Minnesota State tied their season series 2-2. OSU currently has one more league win than Minnesota State (8 vs. 7).

Minnesota State could finish sixth or seventh, and will either be the No. 6 or No. 7 playoff seed. MSU tied OSU 2-2 in the regular season series. MSU needs to sweep Wisconsin this weekend and have OSU get swept at BSU to finish as the No. 6 seed. Then both OSU and MSU would finish with 28 points. The playoff seed tie-breaker would then be based on 9 league wins for MSU vs OSU's 8.

St. Cloud State will finish 8th and will be the No. 8 playoff seed and play at No. 1 seed Wisconsin in the first round.

In this week's (Feb. 14, 2011) USCHO.com Div. 1 Women's Hockey Poll, four of the WCHA's eight-member teams are again ranked in the top ten. In addition to the Badgers at No. 1, Minnesota is ranked No. 3, Minnesota Duluth is ranked No. 6 and North Dakota is ranked No. 8.

Through games of Feb. 14, the eight WCHA women's teams are a combined 24-11-3 in non-conference play this season for a .671 winning percentage.

## WCHA Continues Shootouts; Adopts New Standings Format for League Play in 2010-11

The WCHA is continuing to use shootouts for the 2010-11 season and has also implemented a three-point system in women's league play. In a change this year the WCHA has adopted a standings format for league

play where a team that wins in regulation or overtime receives three points, a team that wins a shootout is awarded two points, a team that loses a shootout gets one point, and a team that loses in regulation or overtime earns no points.

The standings show wins, losses, ties and shootout wins – W-L-T-SW (W-L-T add up to games played, the tie column signifies how many times a team has been to a shootout and the SW column represents how many shootouts a team has won.) Teams are awarded three points for each win in regulation or overtime, and one point for an overtime tie. Conference games tied after 65 minutes advance to a three-player shootout with the winning team receiving an extra point in the standings (denoted in the SW column).

### Directions to Ridder Arena

Located next to Mariucci Arena, which is on Fourth Street SE and Oak Street, Mariucci Arena is easily accessible from both interstates 94 and 35W.

From the north or south, take I-35W to the University Avenue exit and travel southeast to Oak Street. Turn left on Oak Street and travel one block north to Fourth Street.

From the west, take I-94 to 35W North and follow the above

directions.

From the east, take I-94 to the Huron Boulevard exit. Follow Huron Boulevard north until it turns into Fourth Street at the intersection of Oak Street.

## 2011 WCHA Playoffs, NCAA Tournament

The pursuit of the WCHA playoff championship will get underway the weekend of Friday-Sunday, Feb. 25-27 with four, first round conference playoff series. The top four ranked teams in the final regular season standings will all host best-of-three playoff series against the bottom four ranked teams. The No. 1 seed hosting the No. 8 seed, the No. 2 seed hosting the No. 7 seed, the No. 3 seed hosting the No. 6 seed, and the No. 4 seed hosting the No. 5 seed.

Those four first-round conference playoff winners will then advance to the 2011 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF, which is set for March 4-5.

The WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF will be contested at Ridder Arena in Minneapolis and hosted by the University of Minnesota, but with a new twist.

"We have opted to play the championship on Friday (March 4) and Saturday (March 5) this season and we anticipate that giving us an additional boost. And as always, the four participating teams that earn the trip to the FINAL FACE-OFF will put everything on the line to win the tournament and receive the Association's automatic bid into the NCAA tournament championship field."

There will be two semi-final matchups on Friday, with face-offs at 4:07 pm CT and 7:07 pm CT. The championship contest will then be played at 7:07 pm CT on Saturday evening. Minnesota Duluth is the defending WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF champion.

Following the league playoff championship, four NCAA Div. 1 Women's Regional tournaments will be contested the weekend of March 11-14 at sites to be determined.

The four regional winners then earn a trip to the 2011 NCAA Women's Frozen Four, set for March 18 and 20 in Erie, Pa.

## WCHA Announces Record Group of 90 Men's and Women's Scholar-Athletes for 2010-11 Sixth Annual Class Includes 30 Repeat Honorees

MADISON, Wis. – The Western Collegiate Hockey Association, through Commissioner Bruce M. McLeod, Associate Commissioner Sara R. Martin, University of Alaska Anchorage Faculty Representative Steve Strom (Chair, men's league) and University of North Dakota Faculty Representative Sue Jenö (Chair, women's league) today (Feb. 10, 2010) announced that a total of 90 men's and women's student-athletes make up the sixth annual group of WCHA Scholar-Athlete Award recipients. Over the first six years of the award, there have now been 414 honorees representing all 12 men's member and all eight women's member institutions. The previous record for honorees in one season was 80 in 2009-10.

The prestigious WCHA Scholar-Athlete Award was developed through Association member team Faculty Representatives and approved by the conference membership beginning with the 2005-06 season. To earn recognition as a WCHA Scholar-Athlete, conference-member student-athletes must have completed at least one year of residency at their present institution prior to the current academic year and must also have a grade-point average of at least 3.50 on a 4.0 scale for the previous two semesters or three quarters, or may qualify if his or her overall GPA is at least 3.50 for all terms at his or her present institution.

"The Western Collegiate Hockey Association is both thrilled and exceptionally proud to announce this group of men's and women's WCHA Scholar-Athletes for the 2010-11 season," said WCHA Commissioner Bruce M. McLeod, Associate Commissioner Sara R. Martin, University of Alaska Anchorage Faculty Representative Steve Strom (Chair, men's league) and University of North Dakota Faculty Representative Sue Jenö (Chair – women's league) in a joint statement.

"This annual announcement of our Scholar-Athletes has become one of the highlights for the entire Western Collegiate Hockey Association family of student-athletes, coaches and administrators and gives us an opportunity to showcase the fact that along with being great athletes on the ice, these honorees are truly exceptional students off the ice. The rigorous classroom schedules they maintain, as well as their intense commitments to their sport, are most impressive and to be able to achieve what they have is inspiring to all of us. Together, they represent the very best in collegiate athletics."

Thirty (30) of this season's 90 men's and women's WCHA Scholar-Athletes are repeat honorees, including a four-time recipient and 11 three-time winners. Earning the distinguished honor for the fourth time is North Dakota's Chay Genoway (2007-08, 2008-09, 2009-10, 2010-11), who becomes only the third student-athlete to do so. The two other four-time recipients have been Scott McCulloch of Colorado College (2005-06, 2006-07, 2007-08, 2008-09) and Jenna Hewitt of Minnesota State (2006-07, 2007-08, 2008-09, 2009-10).

Eleven other of this season's honorees earned the WCHA Scholar-Athlete award for the third time in their careers. They are: Annie Bauerfeld, BSU; Erin Cody, BSU; Chris Nutini, DU; Kyle Ostrow, DU; Kenny Reiter, UMD; Kyle Schmidt, UMD; Rylan Galiardi, MSU; Austin Lee, MSU; Nina Tikkinen, MSU; Amy Udvig, MSU; and Courtney Josefson, SCSU.

## WCHA Member Team Weekly Notebooks

### Bemidji State Beavers

- The Beavers (10-13-3-2 WCHA, 12-15-3 overall) will finish the 2010-11 regular season this weekend at home hosting Ohio State University.
- Saturday's game will also be senior day for the Beavers, as the team will honor this year's three seniors, Annie Bauerfeld, Erin Cody, and Erin Johnson.
- The Beavers and Buckeyes met previously this season in Columbus, Ohio with BSU only taking one point on the weekend. On Nov. 26 the then-No. 9/10 Buckeyes and Beavers skated to a 2-2 tie, and OSU went on to win the shootout. So far that has been the only shootout loss of the season for Bemidji State. Emily Erickson and Allie Duellman scored for the Beavers in the game with Zuzana Tomcikova making 35 saves. The following game saw Ohio State skate to a 3-1 victory over BSU. Danielle Williams scored the lone goal for the Beavers.
- Overall the Beavers are 15-25-8 against the Buckeyes. Bemidji State has gone 2-9-3 in the past 14 meetings with Ohio State, with the last BSU victory coming on Jan. 23, 2010 in Columbus by a score of 1-0.
- The BSU women's hockey team continued on its losing skid, dropping two games to Minnesota this past weekend, with scores of 4-1 and 3-0. On Feb. 11, the Beavers opened the scoring just :30 into the game as Megan Bozek was called for freezing the puck in the crease resulting in a penalty shot. Cody took the penalty shot for the Beavers and beat UM's goalie Noora Rätty to score her 19th goal of the season. Minnesota went on to score four goals in the first period to help them secure a 4-1 victory. The following night, Rätty posted her ninth shutout of the season stopping 34 shots on goal. The Gophers scored one breakaway goal and one power-play goal before scoring on the open net in the final minute of play to down the Beavers 3-0. In all on the weekend, Tomcikova made 51 saves on 53 shots. The Beaver penalty-kill went 6-7 on the weekend.
- The shutout on Feb. 12 was the third time the Beavers have been shutout on the season and the first time since the Oct. 15 game against then-No. 1 Mercyhurst.
- Bemidji State's women's hockey team has secured a sole fifth-place finish, the best in program history. Last season the Beavers finished tied for fifth in the WCHA, BSU has also finished fifth before in the WCHA, but never with an eight-team conference before.
- With the win over Minnesota State on Jan. 22, the Beavers tied their school record for most home wins in a season with eight. The 1999-2000 squad finished with a 8-7-2 record and with two home games left this season, this year's team could do now worse than finishing 8-7-1 which would still set the mark for the highest home-winning percentage in program history.
- Bemidji State is sixth in the nation for senior class scoring with 65 points. BSU's seniors – Cody, Johnson and Bauerfeld – have combined for 30 goals and 35 assists, averaging 2.17 points per game.
- The forward line of Cody, Sadie Lundquist, and Emily Erickson has scored 37 of the 58 goals this year and have tallied 33 of the 95 assists so far. Cody leads the three with 19 goals and 15 assists, while Erickson has 13 goals and nine assists. Lundquist has six goals and 10 assists. The trio has accounted for 69 of the 153 total points on the season.
- Zuzana Tomcikova has made a total of 576 saves so far this season. In 23 games she has recorded a .932 save percentage and a 1.92 goals-against average.
- So far this new year Bauerfeld has scored four goals and assisted on seven.
- Erin Johnson has also scored four and assisted on seven. She had an eight-game scoring streak, recording at least one point in each of the eight games starting the new year.

### Minnesota Golden Gophers

- The No. 3 Golden Gophers (22-7-2 overall, 17-7-2-1 WCHA) ended their home regular season schedule with a pair of wins over Bemidji State last weekend. With a 4-1 win on Friday and a 3-0 win Saturday, the Gophers

clinched home ice for the first round of the WCHA playoffs and will finish in the top three in the WCHA.

- Noora Raty set a single-season shutout school record and three different Gophers scored as the Gophers earned a 3-0 win last Saturday. Sarah Erickson got the Gophers on the board when she scored on a breakaway at 6:22 in the first. The two teams went scoreless until the 11:54 mark of the third period. Anne Schleper used a screen in front to score a power-play goal at 11:54 in the third period. Kelly Terry scored the empty-net goal at 19:09 in the third period. Raty had 34 saves as she earned her ninth shutout of the season. Raty had 14 saves in the first, 14 in the second and six in the third for a three-period total of 34. On the season, Raty has shut out the likes of Clarkson (Oct. 1), Wayne State (Oct. 9), St. Cloud State (Oct. 22, Oct. 23), Minnesota State (Nov. 19, Jan. 7), Ohio State (Dec. 10), Minnesota Duluth (Jan. 15) and Bemidji State (Feb. 12). Her and Jenny Lura also combined for two additional shutouts against Harvard (Nov. 26) and SCSU (Feb. 4).
- In last Friday's game, Jen Schoullis scored twice in the first period to lead Minnesota to a 4-1 win over the Beavers at Ridder Arena. The Golden Gophers jumped out to their best lead of the season when they went up, 4-1, after the first period. Bemidji State, however, was the team that scored first. The Gophers covered up the puck in the crease, resulting in a penalty shot attempt. BSU's Erin Cody scored on a penalty shot just :30 seconds into the contest to put BSU up, 1-0. However, Minnesota responded back with four goals in the first period. Schoullis scored her first goal of the game at 3:12 in the first. Becky Kortum scored on a one-timer at 11:32. Erickson scored on her own rebound at 12:15. Schoullis concluded the first-period scoring drive with her second goal of the game at 14:26 as Erickson and Amanda Kessel set up the play. With the four goals, the Beavers replaced starting goaltender Alana McElhinney with Zuzana Tomcikova.
- Minnesota is currently second in the conference standings with 54 points, followed by Minnesota Duluth (51), North Dakota (47) and Bemidji State (35).
- The Gophers will face either Minnesota State or Ohio State in a best two-of-three first round playoff series Feb. 25-27. Game times for the Gophers' WCHA first round series are 6:07 pm CT on Friday, 5:07 pm CT on Saturday and 4:07 pm CT on Sunday (if needed).
- The Gophers close out the regular season this weekend as they travel to Grand Forks, N.D. Both games are set for a 7:07 pm CT starts at Ralph Engelstad Arena. UND is one of two teams Minnesota has been swept against this year. Back on Oct. 15-16, the Gophers fell to UND, 4-3 and 3-1 at Ridder Arena.

### Minnesota Duluth Bulldogs

- The No. 6 Bulldogs (18-7-3 overall, 16-7-3 WCHA) earned their third series sweep in a row and extended their current unbeaten streak to seven games with 5-2 and 5-1 wins over Ohio State in Columbus.
- After OSU snuck on the scoreboard at 9:10 of the first period on a power-play goal last Friday night, UMD found the equalizer in the form of senior forward Holmlov's 12th tally of the season at the 16:39. The second period was all UMD, however, and Fridfinnson netted the first of three Bulldog tallies in the stanza at 6:01 on the power-play. Just 1:26 later, freshman forward Brienna Gillanders scored her eighth goal of the year – and first score not on the power-play – to put the Maroon and Gold up 3-1. Fridfinnson netted her ninth goal of the season and seventh in her last seven skates shorthanded to stretch UMD's lead to 4-1 at 11:16. Holmlov chipped in a tally 8:51 into the final period, a goal that also gave Wong her third helper on the night and Larocque her second. The Buckeyes would score at 10:45 to close the score to 5-2 in favor of UMD, but with senior goaltender Kim Martin, who is undefeated against the Buckeyes (10-0-1) over her career, OSU would get no closer. Martin is tied with Riitta Schaublin for all-time goaltender wins at UMD with 65. Martin made 30 saves for UMD on 32 shots and improves her season record to 12-5-2.

- Last Saturday night seven Bulldog players notched points against the Buckeyes at the OSU Ice Rink, including five that recorded two or more. Senior defenseman Jocelyne Larocque, UMD's all-time leading scorer from the blueline, scored a goal and added three assists to become the 14th player in Bulldog history to score 100 career points. Larocque also becomes the first defenseman in UMD history to reach the milestone, and joins current teammates Elin Holmlov, Laura Fridfinnson and Haley Irwin to form a 100-point quartet. The Bulldogs broke the game open in the second stanza, with rookie Brienna Gillanders scoring her eighth goal on the power-play 3:52 into the period. Katie Willson and Holmlov – who has taken over the top of the Bulldog scoring chart in the absence of Irwin with 40 points – each added goals to give UMD a 3-0 lead after two periods of play. Larocque added a power-play stroke of her own at the 12:05 mark in the third period, and reached her milestone with :40 seconds remaining in regulation with a power-play helper to sophomore forward Audrey Cournoyer, who, also had two assists of her own. Jennifer Harss made 26 saves between the pipes, and UMD went 3-of-5 with the extra skater, while OSU was scoreless in four attempts.
- Irwin missed her sixth game in a row, and seventh in UMD's last eight outings due to injury. In Irwin's absence, Holmlov has now become the Bulldogs' leading scorer with 40 points (14g, 26a). Holmlov has 13 points her last seven skates, netting seven goals and adding six helpers.
- Kim Martin's assist on Fridfinnson's first goal last Friday night was the first assist by a UMD netminder since Jennifer Harss did it against Minnesota earlier this season on Oct. 29.
- The Bulldogs will host St. Cloud State this weekend at AMSOIL Arena to put the wraps on the regular season. UMD is 38-9-2 all-time against the Huskies, and had a win and a tie in St. Cloud earlier this season on Dec. 3-4.
- This Saturday night will mark senior night for UMD's four seniors – Larocque, Holmlov, Tara Gray and Fridfinnson.

## Minnesota State Mavericks

- The Mavericks (8-21-3 overall, 7-18-1-0 WCHA) host top-ranked Wisconsin on the final weekend of the regular season. The Mavericks and Badgers meet at All Seasons Arena on Friday at 7:07 pm CT and Saturday at 3:07 pm CT.
- The Mavericks are 1-45-2 overall against Wisconsin. MSU's 5-3 win over Wisconsin last season (Feb. 12, 2010) saw goaltender Alli Altmann finish with a career-high 48 saves.
- Earlier this season the Mavericks traveled to Madison to face the Badgers and were swept by scores of 3-2 and 6-1. Junior Emmi Leinonen, freshman Kathleen Rogan and Smith each scored goals.
- Last weekend the Mavericks split the series with St. Cloud State last weekend, losing 2-0 Friday and winning Saturday's final 3-1.
- The Mavericks were shutout last Friday for the third-straight game, marking the first time since the 2004-05 season the team had been shutout three straight games. St. Cloud State used two second-period goals to earn its first victory of the 2010-11 season. The Huskies went up 1-0 on an unassisted shorthanded tally at 6:43 by freshman forward Molli Mott who capitalized on a Maverick turnover. St. Cloud State then capitalized on its first power-play chance of the game at 12:39 of the second period when sophomore forward Alex Nelson tipped in a goal in front of Altmann, giving the Huskies a 2-0 win. Minnesota State was outshot 33 to 23, with MSU going 0-for-4 with an extra skater and the Huskies going 1-for-7. Altmann finished with a game-high 31 saves and SCSU's netminder Ashley Nixon all 23 Maverick shots. Senior forward Lisa Edman ended MSU's scoring troubles with the game-tying first period last Saturday after Lisa Martinson had given SCSU the first period lead. Freshman Kathleen Rogan, MSU's leading scorer with 12 goals and 21 points, Rogan gave Minnesota State its first lead of the weekend when sophomore center Lauren Smith capitalized on a 2-on-1 with a cross-net pass to Rogan who beat Nixon for the shorthanded, game-winning goal. Kari Lundberg finished the afternoon with two assists. Altmann earned

her fourth win of the year on 30 saves, while Nixon stopped 29 MSU shots. The Mavericks had 32 shots to SCSU's 31.

## North Dakota Fighting Sioux

- The No. 8 Fighting Sioux (17-10-3 overall, 15-9-2-0 WCHA) suffered a series and season sweep to top-ranked Wisconsin last weekend at the Kohl Center in Madison, Wis.
- In last Friday's 5-0 loss, Wisconsin's Meghan Duggan and Hilary Knight accounted for all of the goals. Duggan netted a hat trick and Knight scored the other two goals. The Sioux were held to a season-low 10 shots on goal in the game. In Sunday's 8-4 loss, the Badgers scored five times in the second period en route to the victory. The Sioux outshot the Badgers in the first period 12-10 and surpassed yesterday's shot total but still trailed 2-1 at the first intermission. Sophomore Mary Loken scored twice while Stephanie Roy and Ashley Furia each contributed one goal for the Sioux.
- Wisconsin was the only team on the season to win the regular-season series against the Sioux who swept both meetings.
- Sophomores Jocelyne Lamoureux and Monique Lamoureux-Kolls rank fourth and fifth respectively in the conference in points behind three Wisconsin players. Lamoureux has 43 points and Lamoureux-Kolls has 38 in conference games.
- The Sioux will conclude the 2010-11 regular season hosting league rival Minnesota at the Ralph Engelstad Arena on Feb. 18-19. UND has announced Operation 3021 for the weekend where it is trying to break the program's single-game and series records. UND swept the Gophers earlier this season at Ridder Arena in Minneapolis by scores of 4-3 and 3-1.

## Ohio State Buckeyes

- The Buckeyes (14-16-2 overall, 8-16-2-2 WCHA) wrap up the regular season by playing at Bemidji State at 2:07 pm CT on both Friday and Saturday.
- The Beavers and Buckeyes met previously this season in Columbus, Ohio. On Nov. 26 the then-No. 9/10 Buckeyes and Beavers skated to a 2-2 tie, and OSU went on to win the shootout. The following game saw Ohio State skate to a 3-1 victory.
- Overall the Buckeyes are 25-15-8 against the Beavers. OSU has gone 9-2-3 in the past 14 meetings with BSU.
- Last weekend (Feb. 11-12), the Buckeyes dropped two games to Minnesota Duluth, 5-2 and 5-1, in the final regular-season home games at the OSU Ice Rink. The Buckeyes' five seniors were recognized before the opening faceoff.
- Last Friday, freshman goalie Lisa Steffes broke the single season record for most saves in a season when her 31 stops surpassed the school mark of Lisa Bonanno, who recorded 886 in the 2008-09 season.
- Last Saturday, after a scoreless first period, the Bulldogs went up 3-0 after the second period. Brienna Gillanders opened the scoring with a power-play goal at 3:52, as her shot trickled over the line. Minnesota Duluth extended the lead to 2-0 on Katherine Wilson's goal from the slot off a 2-on-1 at 12:52. Elin Holmlov scored on a rebound from the just outside the crease at 15:37 to make the score 3-0. Shots were 19-8 in favor of the Bulldogs in the period, with Steffes making 16 saves. Jocelyne Larocque scored 12:05 into the third period to give the Bulldogs a four-goal lead. At 13:48 Buckeye junior Natalie Spooner scored unassisted, beating the goalie high for her team-best 25th goal of the year, to break up the shutout. With the goal, Spooner ties former Buckeye Jana Harrigan (2003-06) for second on the all-time career list with 68 goals. The final score came from Audrey Cournoyer with :40 seconds remaining. Shots in the game were 38-27 in favor of the Bulldogs. Steffes had 33 saves in 59:58 between the pipes. For Minnesota Duluth, Jennifer Harss had 26 saves in 59:56. The Buckeyes were unable to score on four power-play chances, while the Bulldogs converted three-of-five opportunities.

### St. Cloud State Huskies

- The Huskies (1-24-1-1 WCHA, 1-29-1 overall) garnered their first win of the season on Friday, Feb. 11, blanking league rival Minnesota State University, Mankato 2-0 in the National Hockey Center. St. Cloud State's special teams were brilliant in the win as rookie forward Molli Mott netted her first career game-winning goal on the penalty-kill. Mott's shorthanded score came at the 6:45 mark of the second frame. SCSU's insurance tally came in the same period and was scored by sophomore Alex Nelson at 12:39 on the power-play. Ashley Nixon, SCSU's senior netminder, also reached a career milestone last Friday night. Backstopping the Huskies with 23 saves, the shutout win for Nixon tied former Husky goalie Lauri St. Jacques (2004-07) for the most career shutouts in the Cardinal and Black with six. The Huskies came focused and ready to play on Friday as SCSU's initial 14-of-15 shots in the first 32 minutes of action were on net.
- St. Cloud State's win snapped a 31-game winless streak dating back to Feb. 27, 2010.
- Minnesota State came from behind on Saturday, Feb. 12, to defeat the St. Cloud State women's hockey squad by a score of 3-1 on Senior Day in the National Hockey Center to earn the series split. The Huskies cracked the scoreboard first at the 6:50 mark of the initial period. St. Cloud State sophomore defender Lisa Martinson gathered up the puck just inside the blue line and made a great move around a Maverick defender to storm the slot. With traffic in front, Martinson sent a wrist to the far side of the MSU net past Minnesota State's junior netminder Alli Altmann for her second tally of the season and sixth of her collegiate career. SCSU's Haylea Schmid and Brittany Toor were awarded the helpers on the even-strength score. SCSU's Nixon, who was named the game's Third Star, backstopped the Huskies with 29 saves in her final game at the National Hockey Center.
- St. Cloud State University honored its four seniors in Alecia Anderson, Courtney Josefson, Diana Karouzos and Nixon before last Saturday's game for Senior Day.
- The Huskies will hit the road this weekend for their last regular season WCHA series of the 2010-11 stint on Friday and Saturday, Feb. 18-19, at the University of Minnesota Duluth.

### Wisconsin Badgers

- The Badgers (28-2-2, 22-2-2-2 WCHA) travel to Mankato, Minn., for their final regular season series this weekend. The Badgers face-off against Minnesota State (8-21-3, 7-18-1-0 WCHA) Friday at 7:07 pm CT and conclude the series Saturday at 3:07 pm CT.
- The Badgers are currently on an 18-game unbeaten streak, posting a 16-0-2 record since losing to Minnesota Duluth on November 28, 2010.
- The Badgers scored 13 goals last weekend as Wisconsin swept No. 8 North Dakota in its final home series of the regular season. UW earned a 5-0 shutout win last Friday and followed up with an 8-4 victory on Senior Day on Sunday. Meghan Duggan led Wisconsin with six points, including five goals, in the two games, and Brianna Decker tallied five points on two goals and three assists.
- A trio of Badgers recorded four-point weekends vs UND in Madison Packer (4a), Brooke Ammerman (1g, 3a) and Hilary Knight (3g, 1a).
- Goaltenders Alex Rigsby and Becca Ruegsegger split the series vs UND in nets. Rigsby earned her fifth shutout as a Badger, saving all 10 shots she faced to improve to 19-1-2 on Friday before Ruegsegger made 23 saves to improve to 9-1-0 on the season.
- The Badgers honored their six seniors, Duggan, Mallory Deluce, Anne Dronen, Kelly Nash, Carla Pentimone and Geena Prough in their final home game of the regular season, and capped the celebration with their 8-4 win over North Dakota last Sunday. After the game, Commissioner Sara Martin presented the WCHA trophy to the Badgers.
- Wisconsin owns a 45-1-2 all-time record against Minnesota State. The Badgers swept the Mavericks at the Kohl Center Oct. 29-30, picking up a 3-2 victory and a 6-1 win. The last series in Mankato, Minn., saw Wisconsin earn the road sweep with a 3-0 shutout and a 6-2 victory Dec. 11-12, 2009.
- The Badgers' two wins over North Dakota extended Wisconsin's unbeaten streak to 18 games at 16-0-2. The current streak is the program's longest since opening the 2008-09 season with a 20-game unbeaten streak (18-0-2).

## WCHA Women's Tie-Breaking Procedures • For Playoff Seeding Purposes Only

At the conclusion of the regular season, teams will be ranked by the number of points accumulated. If two teams are tied for first place, they will be declared co-WCHA champions.

The first round of the WCHA's post-season tournament will be a best-of-three games format at the home site of the teams ranked higher in the final regular season standings. All eight teams participate in the first round of the tournament. First round playoff pairings will be: #1 rank vs #8 rank, #2 rank vs #7 rank, #3 vs #6, and #4 vs #5.

Following the four first round series, the four winning teams will be re-seeded #1 thru #4 according to their standings in the final WCHA in-season competition and will advance to the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF.

In the event that ties are encountered in the determination of WCHA ranking or designation of home teams for playoff purposes, the following procedures will be used in the order given to break the ties:

- If two or more teams are tied, head-to-head competition during the regular (conference) season will be used to break the tie.
- If two or more teams are still tied after (a), the highest seed will go to the team with the most WCHA (conference) wins during the regular season.
- If two or more teams played a four-game series during the regular season and the teams have the same win-loss records for those series and the same number of WCHA wins, the team having the least number of goals scored against it in the four-game series shall have the higher rank. If two or more teams played a two-game series during the regular season, proceed to tie-breaker d).
- If two or more teams are still tied after applying the provisions of (a), (b) and (c), the team having the greatest "winning margin" during the regular season will have the higher rank. Winning margin = WCHA goals for during the regular season minus WCHA goals against.
- Games played against WCHA opponents in holiday tournaments will not be counted in the determinations.
- Shootout wins used during the WCHA regular season will not be counted in the determinations. Shootout games will be recorded as a tie in the determinations.
