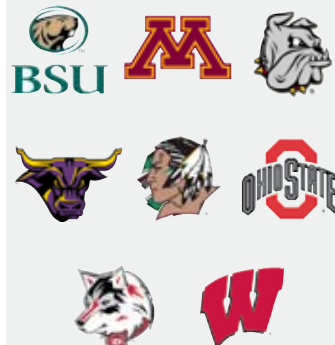

# All Eight WCHA-Member Teams Engage in League Play Feb. 4-5 as OSU Hosts UND, SCSU Visits UM, MSU Hosts UMD, UW Heads to BSU; Record Crowd Watches Wisconsin Inch within Title Clinch Three Weeks Remain in Regular Season as Three Points Separate Second Place UM, Third Place UND and Fourth Place UMD; Top-Ranked Wisconsin Defeats UM Jan. 29 before Div. 1 Women's Record Crowd of 10,668 at Kohl Center ... Badgers Stretch Unbeaten Streak to 14 Games; UWS' Duggan Pushes Scoring Streak to 24 Games; WCHA's Non-Conference Record at 24-11-3 (.671); Four WCHA Teams Again Ranked Among Nation's Top 10 in Latest USCHO.com Div. 1 Women's Poll ... MADISON, Wis. – Top-ranked University of Wisconsin used an old rival and the biggest crowd in women's college hockey history to take five of six points last weekend (Jan. 28-29) and pull within two points of clinching the 2011 Western Collegiate Hockey Association regular season championship.

The Badgers have two previous WCHA regular season crowns under their belts, having won back-to-back titles in 2006 and 2007. Defending conference champions are Minnesota Duluth and Minnesota, who shared the title a season ago.

The host Badgers skated to a 2-2 (ot) tie with No. 4-ranked Minnesota last Friday night before securing a 3-1 win in last Saturday's "Fill the Bowl" game at the Kohl Center. On Jan. 28, the Badgers earned their second-straight shootout win (3-1, 3 rounds) to gain an extra point in the WCHA standings. Then on Jan. 29, Wisconsin set a NCAA women's hockey single game attendance record when 10,668 fans were on hand. The "Fill the Bowl" crowd broke the previous women's attendance record of 8,263, which the Badgers set at last year's outdoor

On the weekend, Wisconsin senior forward Meghan Duggan led the Badgers with three points (one goal, two assists) while extending her program-record point-scoring streak to 24 games. With six games (or 18 points) left in the regular season, the Badgers, who are unbeaten in their last 14 games at 12-0-2, need to record just two points to clinch their first title since 2007.

Wisconsin's two-game set at Bemidji State this weekend (Friday, Feb. 4 and Saturday, Feb. 5) is among a full slate of four WCHA series being contested. The Badgers (24-2-2, 18-2-2-2 WCHA) and Beavers (12-11-3, 10-9-3 WCHA) will face-off at BSU's new Sanford Center (4,250) at 6:07 pm CT on Friday and 4:07 pm CT on Saturday afternoon. The first series between the two clubs, on the opening weekend of Oct. 8-10, saw host Wisconsin win 7-1 and 2-0.

Second place Minnesota (18-7-2, 13-7-2-1 WCHA) returns home to Ridder Arena (3,400) to entertain St. Cloud State (0-26-1, 0-21-1-1 WCHA) at 7:07 pm CT Friday evening and 4:07 pm CT on Saturday afternoon. The Golden Gophers are 2-0-0 vs the Huskies this season, with 5-0 and 3-0 victories at St. Cloud back on Oct. 22-23.

Third place North Dakota (15-8-3, 13-7-2 WCHA) will hit the road to take on Ohio State (14-12-2, 8-12-2-2 WCHA) at the OSU Ice Rink (800), with puck drops set for Friday at 7:07 pm ET and Saturday at 4:07 pm ET. In their first two-game series of the 2010-11 season on Nov. 6-7 in Grand Forks, the host Sioux won the opener 3-2 (ot) before the two teams played to a 2-2 (ot) tie in game two (OSU won the ensuing shootout, 2-0 in 2 rounds).

In Mankato this weekend, Minnesota State (7-18-3, 6-15-1 WCHA) will play host to Minnesota Duluth (14-7-3, 12-7-3 WCHA) at All Seasons Arena (750) for a 7:07 pm CT face-off on Friday night and a 3:07 pm CT start on Saturday. The Bulldogs lead the season series vs the Mavericks, 2-0, by virtue of 5-2 and 6-0 victories at the DECC in Duluth back on Oct. 16-17.

This week's WCHA standings show Wisconsin (24-2-2, 18-2-2-2 WCHA) in first place with 58 points and Minnesota (18-7-2, 15-7-2-1 WCHA) second place with 42. North Dakota (15-8-3, 13-7-2-0 WCHA) is one point back of the Gophers in third with 41 points while Minnesota Duluth (14-7-3, 12-7-3-0 WCHA) is two points back of the Sioux in fourth with 39 points. Bemidji State (12-11-3, 10-9-3-2 WCHA) stands fifth with 35 points while Ohio State (14-12-2, 8-12-2-2 WCHA) is sixth with 28. Minnesota State (7-18-3, 6-15-1-0 WCHA) is in seventh place with 19 points and St. Cloud State (0-26-1, 0-21-1-1 WCHA) is eighth with two points.

Despite Wisconsin's lead at the top of the league, there is a hotly-contested race for a finish in the top four in the final standings – and home ice for the first round of the league playoffs – with seven points separating second place Minnesota and fifth place Bemidji. In WCHA action last weekend (Jan. 28-29), Ohio State captured its second straight sweep on the road, beating St. Cloud State 6-1 behind three goals by Natalie Spooner in the series opener and 3-2 on Ally Tarr's goal in the final :51 seconds to complete the sweep.

Defending national champion Minnesota Duluth won for the first time at its new rink, AMSOIL Arena, beating Bemidji State twice. Senior forward Laura Fridfinnson scored twice and senior forward Elin Holmlöv picked up the game-winning goal as the Bulldogs topped the Beavers, 4-3, in the first game. Then last Saturday, Pernilla Winberg had a goal and two assists as UMD moved into fourth place (the last home playoff spot) with a 5-3 victory over BSU.

In Grand Forks, Jocelyne Lamoureux scored a goal and added three assists while Monique Lamoureux-Kolls and Allison Parizek each scored twice to lead North Dakota to last Friday night's 6-1 win over Minnesota State at Ralph Engelstad Arena. But the visiting Mavericks rebounded last Saturday and ended two streaks in the process. Melissa Klippenstein and Kelsie Scott scored a goal and an assist each as the Mavericks scored four unanswered goals to end a 15-game winless streak with a 5-3 win against UND. The decision also ended an eight-game unbeaten streak, a program high, for the Sioux.

In this week's (Jan. 31) USCHO.com Div. 1 Women's Hockey Poll, four of the WCHA's eight-member teams are again ranked in the top ten. In addition to the Badgers at No. 1, Minnesota is No. 4, Minnesota Duluth is ranked No. 6 and North Dakota is at No. 8. Also receiving votes from the WCHA were Bemidji State and Ohio State.

Looking ahead to the weekend of Feb. 11-13 the four WCHA series find Minnesota Duluth traveling to Ohio State (Friday/Saturday), Minnesota hosting Bemidji State (Friday/Saturday), Minnesota State traveling to St. Cloud State (Friday/Saturday) and Wisconsin hosting North Dakota (Friday/Sunday).

The final three weeks of the regular season will feature all league games. Through games of Jan. 31, the eight WCHA-member women's teams are a combined 24-11-3 in non-conference play for a .671 winning percentage.

## WCHA Continues Shootouts; Adopts New Standings Format for League Play in 2010-11

The WCHA is continuing to use shootouts for the 2010-11 season and has also implemented a three-point system in women's league play. In a change this year the WCHA has adopted a standings format for league play where a team that wins in regulation or overtime receives three points, a team that wins a shootout is awarded two points, a team that loses a shootout gets one point, and a team that loses in regulation or overtime earns no points.

The standings show wins, losses, ties and shootout wins – W-L-T-SW (W-L-T add up to games played, the tie column signifies how many times a team has been to a shootout and the SW column represents how many shootouts a team has won.) Teams are awarded three points for each win in regulation or overtime, and one point for an overtime tie. Conference games tied after 65 minutes advance to a three-player shootout with the winning team receiving an extra point in the standings (denoted in the SW column).

## 2011 WCHA Playoffs, NCAA Tournament

The pursuit of the WCHA playoff championship will get underway the weekend of Friday-Sunday, Feb. 25-27 with four, first round conference playoff series. The top four ranked teams in the final regular season standings will all host best-of-three playoff series against the bottom four ranked teams. The No. 1 seed hosting the No. 8 seed, the No. 2 seed

hosting the No. 7 seed, the No. 3 seed hosting the No. 6 seed, and the No. 4 seed hosting the No. 5 seed.

Those four first-round conference playoff winners will then advance to the 2011 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF, which is set for March 4-5.

The WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF will be contested at Ridder Arena in Minneapolis and hosted by the University of Minnesota, but with a new twist.

"We have opted to play the championship on Friday (March 4) and Saturday (March 5) this season and we anticipate that giving us an additional boost. And as always, the four participating teams that earn the trip to the FINAL FACE-OFF will put everything on the line to win the tournament and receive the Association's automatic bid into the NCAA tournament championship field."

There will be two semi-final matchups on Friday, with face-offs at 4:07 pm CT and 7:07 pm CT. The championship contest will then be played at 7:07 pm CT on Saturday evening. Minnesota Duluth is the defending WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF champion.

Following the league playoff championship, four NCAA Div. 1 Women's Regional tournaments will be contested the weekend of March 11-14 at sites to be determined.

The four regional winners then earn a trip to the 2011 NCAA Women's Frozen Four, set for March 18 and 20 in Erie, Pa.

From the north or south, take I-35W to the University Avenue exit and travel southeast to Oak Street. Turn left on Oak Street and travel one block north to Fourth Street.

From the west, take I-94 to 35W North and follow the above directions.

From the east, take I-94 to the Huron Boulevard exit. Follow Huron Boulevard north until it turns into Fourth Street at the intersection of Oak Street.

General parking is available in the Gopher lot across Oak Street from Mariucci Arena.

## WCHA Member Team Weekly Notebooks

### Bemidji State Beavers

- The Beavers (10-9-3-2 in WCHA and 12-11-3 overall) return home to host No. 1 University of Wisconsin on Friday and Saturday, Feb. 4-5, at the Sanford Center.
- The Beavers played then-No. 5 Wisconsin to open conference play over the Oct. 8-10 weekend in Madison, Wis. Over that weekend the Badgers claimed a sweep, winning the first game 7-1 and the second 2-0. Annie Bauerfeld was the lone Beaver to score, claiming the first goal. However, the Badgers went on to score the next nine goals in the series. Montana Vichorek and Erin Cody tallied the assists on the play.
- Overall the Beavers are 3-41-2 against the Badgers. Last season the Beavers claimed two victories over Wisconsin, downing them 1-0 in Coleraine, Minn., and 2-0 in Madison.
- With Zuzana Tomcikova in Turkey participating in the World University Games, Alana McElhinney will be called upon to make both starts in net against the Badgers. McElhinney is familiar with Wisconsin as she played both games in the Madison series last year, while Tomcikova was in Vancouver with the Winter Olympics. She turned away 36 shots to claim her first career shutout in the 2-0 win Feb. 7.
- The Beavers dropped both games over the Jan. 28-29 weekend to No. 6 Minnesota Duluth at the new AMSOIL Arena, by scores of 4-3 and 5-3. The Beavers opened the scoring in both games, as Erin Cody recorded her 100th-career point scoring an unassisted goal at the 3:04 mark of the first period. Cody then went on to notch her second hat trick of the season, scoring two goals in the second period to tie the game at 3-3 heading into the third period. The Bulldogs claimed the go-ahead goal at the 4:03 mark of the period and held on to the one-goal lead to claim its 49th program victory over the Beavers. Montana Vichorek picked up two assists in the second period and Marlee Wheelhouse and Erin Johnson each had one. McElhinney made 31 saves in her fourth start of the season. The next night Kimberly Lieder scored her first goal of the season to open the scoring at the 1:33 mark of the first period. Just like the night before, UMD went on to claim a 3-1 lead in the second period and BSU went on to lose 5-3. Molly Arola scored her first collegiate goal on the power-play and Erin Johnson scored at the 13:06 mark. Tess Dusik, Wheelhouse and Bauerfeld all tallied assists on the two goals.
- Bemidji State successfully killed eight of nine penalties against UMD on the weekend. UMD's power-play goal last Friday night ended BSU's penalty-kill streak at 29.
- The forward line of Cody, Sadie Lundquist, and Emily Erickson has scored 36 of the 54 goals this year and have tallied 32 of the 91 assists so far. Cody leads the three with 17 goals and 14 assists, while Erickson has 13 goals and nine assists and Lundquist has six goals and nine assists. The trio has also accounted for 68 of the 145 total points on the season.
- So far this new year Bauerfeld has had a hand in 11 of the 21 goals scored by BSU (4g, 7a). Johnson has also helped in 11 of those past 21 goals, scoring four and assisting on seven. She has recorded at least one point in each of the past eight games.
- In WCHA games only, the women's hockey team is ranked first with a 90.7% penalty-kill. Spanning back to Dec. 4, the Beavers have successfully killed 35 of the last 36 penalties.
- Also in conference games only, the Beavers are ranked sixth on the power-play having scored 14 goals on 78 opportunities (17.9%).
- Setting a record in style, Cody eclipsed the century mark for career points by recording a hat trick against Duluth on Jan. 28. She surpassed Kelly Hart (100) on the all-time points list at BSU and now sits 20 points behind and Amber Fryklund (122).

### Minnesota Golden Gophers

- The No. 4 Golden Gophers (18-7-2 overall, 13-7-2-1 WCHA) traveled to No. 1 Wisconsin last weekend and went 0-1-1 on the weekend. After a 2-2 (ot) tie on Friday (shootout loss), the Golden Gophers fell, 3-1, Saturday in front of 10,668 fans in Madison.
- In last Friday's game, Minnesota and Wisconsin skated to a 2-2 tie. Meghan Duggan got the Badgers on the board early when she scored a power-play goal at 2:08 in the first period. Sarah Davis tipped in a Sam Downey shot from the point to tie the game at 1-1. However, Mallory Deluce helped the Badgers take another lead at 14:46 to put the game at 2-1 after two. Minnesota responded and tied the game at 1:16 in the third with Kelly Terry scoring her 12th goal. The two teams battled back and forth for the remainder of the game, but the game remained 2-2 and headed into overtime. Raty made some fantastic saves, including some crucial ones during the Gopher penalty-kill to stuff the Badgers. Wisconsin, however, won the shootout, 3-1. ### Minnesota Duluth Bulldogs

- The No. 6 Bulldogs (14-7-3 overall, 12-7-3 WCHA) snapped a five-game winless streak and won its first game in its new home, AMSOIL Arena, with a 4-3 victory over Bemidji State on Friday, Jan. 28. The Bulldogs then completed the sweep with a 5-3 victory last Saturday. It was the first home sweep for the Bulldogs in nearly three months, but it could not have come at a more important time as UMD moved ahead of Bemidji State and into fourth place.
- Laura Fridfinnson recorded three goals against Bemidji State. The native of Arborg, Manitoba, who more than doubled her goal intake on the season over the weekend, scored back-to-back tallies in last Friday's 4-3 win over the Beavers. Fridfinnson scored 1:14 into the second period, and then repeated her effort on the power-play just a little over three minutes later. - Freshman Kathleen Rogan tallied assist number nine of the season at UND, which bumps her team-high point total to 11-9=20. Rogan ranks tied for 23rd in the WCHA in points (20), tied for 15th in goals scored and fifth in freshman scoring.

- Junior goaltender Alli Altmann started last Friday's game and suffered her 15th loss of the season. She allowed six goals, had 35 saves, with a .854 save percentage.

- Freshman goaltender Danielle Butters started last Saturday's game at North Dakota and earned her fourth win of the season. She allowed three goals, had 28 saves, with a .903 save percentage.

- When the Mavericks score three or more goals they own a record of 7-0-0. When they score two or less, they are 0-18-3.

- Out of Minnesota State's 14 series this season, MSU has swept its opponent two times and been swept seven times.

## North Dakota Fighting Sioux

- The No. 8 Fighting Sioux (15-8-3 overall, 13-7-2-0 WCHA) split their second series of the season against Minnesota State last weekend at the Ralph Engelstad Arena.

- In last Friday's 6-1 win, the Sioux were led by sophomore Jocelyne Lamoureux, who had a four-point game with one goal and two assists while Allison Parizek and Monique Lamoureux-Kolls each added a pair of goals. The forward line of Mary Loken, Alyssa Wiebe and Parizek combined for three goals and two assists. Junior Stephanie Ney picked up her seventh consecutive win making 21 saves. - UND will now go on the road for the next two weekends starting with Ohio State and then heading to Wisconsin.

## St. Cloud State Huskies

- The Huskies (0-21-1-1 WCHA, 0-26-1 overall) were swept by Ohio State at home last weekend.
- St. Cloud State suffered a heart-breaking 3-2 loss last Saturday and on Friday, Jan. 28, OSU cruised past SCSU 6-1 in the National Hockey Center. SCSU's Julia Gilbert netted her fourth career goal to snap the Huskies' 298:21 minute scoreless streak. Of note, Gilbert started and ended the scoreless streak for the Huskies as she was the last SCSU player to light the lamp at the 12:54 mark of the third period against Bemidji State on Saturday, Jan. 8, in the NHC. St. Cloud State went over 14 periods of play without scoring in the ever-grueling WCHA. Ashley Nixon, SCSU's senior netminder, tabbed 26 saves in the loss on Jan. 28, bringing her career total to 2,792. She needs 285 saves to tie SCSU career leader Laura Gieselmen, who backstopped the Huskies with 3,077 saves from 1999-00.
- Last Saturday (Jan. 29) afternoon was a different story for the Huskies as the Buckeyes edged SCSU in a 3-2 win. St. Cloud State played its heart out against Ohio State but a late goal by OSU's Ally Tarr at the 19:09 mark of the final period handed the Huskies a devastating one-goal loss. - Last Saturday night, Wisconsin set a new NCAA women's hockey attendance record with 10,668 fans at the Kohl Center. UW's "Fill the Bowl" crowd broke the previous NCAA attendance record of 8,263, which the Badgers set at last year's outdoor Camp Randall Hockey Classic.
- On the Jan. 28-29 weekend, senior Meghan Duggan led the Badgers with three points on one goal and two assists, extending her program-record point streak to 24 games.
- In addition, Brianna Decker is also on a record-long point streak; her 19-game streak is tied for the third-longest in UW history.

## WCHA Women's Tie-Breaking Procedures • For Playoff Seeding Purposes Only

At the conclusion of the regular season, teams will be ranked by the number of points accumulated. If two teams are tied for first place, they will be declared co-WCHA champions.

The first round of the WCHA's post-season tournament will be a best-of-three games format at the home site of the teams ranked higher in the final regular season standings. All eight teams participate in the first round of the tournament. First round playoff pairings will be: #1 rank vs #8 rank, #2 rank vs #7 rank, #3 vs #6, and #4 vs #5.

Following the four first round series, the four winning teams will be re-seeded #1 thru #4 according to their standings in the final WCHA in-season competition and will advance to the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF.

In the event that ties are encountered in the determination of WCHA ranking or designation of home teams for playoff purposes, the following procedures will be used in the order given to break the ties:

- If two or more teams are tied, head-to-head competition during the regular (conference) season will be used to break the tie.
- If two or more teams are still tied after (a), the highest seed will go to the team with the most WCHA (conference) wins during the regular season.
- If two or more teams played a four-game series during the regular season and the teams have the same win-loss records for those series and the same number of WCHA wins, the team having the least number of goals scored against it in the four-game series shall have the higher rank. If two or more teams played a two-game series during the regular season, proceed to tie-breaker d).
- If two or more teams are still tied after applying the provisions of (a), (b) and (c), the team having the greatest "winning margin" during the regular season will have the higher rank. Winning margin = WCHA goals for during the regular season minus WCHA goals against.
- Games played against WCHA opponents in holiday tournaments will not be counted in the determinations.
- Shootout wins used during the WCHA regular season will not be counted in the determinations. Shootout games will be recorded as a tie in the determinations.
