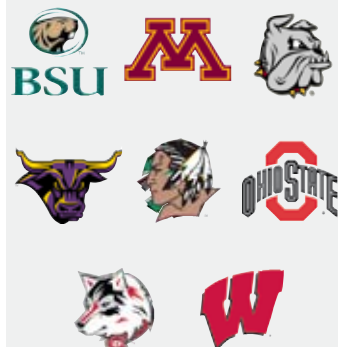

It's Playoff Time! WCHA First Round Match Ups Have #8 SCSU at #1 UW, #7 MSU at #2 UMD, #6 OSU at #3 UM, #5 BSU at #4 UND

Top-Ranked Wisconsin Enters Post-Season with 20-Game Unbeaten Streak; Defending WCHA Playoff, NCAA Champion Bulldogs Stand 8-0-1 Over Last Nine; Wisconsin's Duggan is WCHA Scoring Champion; UMD's Martin Captures League Goaltending Title; WCHA Has Eight Nominees for Patty Kazmaier Memorial Award; WCHA's Non-Conference Record at 24-11-3 (.671); Four WCHA-Member Teams Again Ranked Among Nation's Top 10 in Latest USCHO.com Div. 1 Poll ... UW No. 1, UM No. 3, UMD No. 6, UND No. 8; Tickets Still Available for 2011 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF, March 4-5 at Ridder Arena in Minneapolis

MADISON, Wis. – The second season in the women's Western Collegiate Hockey Association's begins this weekend (Friday, Feb. 25, Saturday, Feb. 26 and Sunday, Feb. 27) with its four nationally-ranked teams all hosting first round, best-of-three playoff series.

Top-ranked Wisconsin enters the playoffs on a 20-game unbeaten streak (18-0-2) which earned them the regular season league title, the fourth 30-win season in program history and the league's top seed.

Minnesota and Minnesota Duluth, after tying for the league's regular season title a season ago, tied for second this season. But UMD, by virtue of a 2-1-1 advantage in the four-game head-to-head regular season series, earned the No. 2 seed for the league playoffs.

So the playoffs get underway as No. 1 seed Wisconsin (30-2-2) hosts No. 8 seed St. Cloud State (1-31-1) at

Eagles' Nest in Verona, Wis., No. 2 Minnesota Duluth (20-7-3) hosts No. 7 Minnesota State (8-23-3) at AMSOIL Arena, No. 3 seed Minnesota (23-8-2) entertains No. 6 seed Ohio State (14-17-3) at Ridder Arena in Minneapolis and No. 4 seed North Dakota (18-11-3) hosts No. 5 seed Bemidji State (13-15-4) at Purpur Arena in Grand Forks, N.D.

Game two of each series will be played on Saturday (Feb. 26) and game three, if necessary, will be contested on Sunday (Feb. 27). The winners of the four best-of-three series advance to the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF at Ridder Arena in Minneapolis March 4-5.

The Badgers went 4-0 against the SCSU Huskies during the regular season, winning 5-0 and 6-1 in St. Cloud on Dec. 10 and Dec. 11 and 10-0 and 6-0 in Madison on Jan. 14 and Jan. 16.

The UMD Bulldogs won all four of their regular season encounters against the MSU Mavericks, claiming 5-2 and 6-0 victories in Duluth on Oct. 16-17 and 7-0 and 3-0 wins in Mankato on Feb. 4-5.

The Golden Gophers were 4-0 against the OSU Buckeyes during the 2010-11 regular season. Minnesota won 6-0 and 2-1 (ot) over Ohio State on Dec. 10 and Dec. 12 in Minneapolis and 4-2 and 8-1 in Columbus on Jan. 21-22.

The Fighting Sioux, meanwhile, went 2-1-1 against the BSU Beavers this season. In Bemidji on Nov. 12 and Nov. 13, Bemidji State won 2-1 in game one before the two clubs tied 1-1 (ot) in game two. In Grand Forks on Jan. 15-16, North Dakota prevailed by 5-2 and 6-2 counts.

Wisconsin's all-time leading scorer Meghan Duggan won the league's scoring championship for 2010-11 and Minnesota Duluth's Kim Martin was the WCHA's top goaltender. Duggan, a senior forward from Danvers, Mass., had 27 goals, 34 assists and 61 points in 28 league games, averaging 2.18 points per game. She topped teammates Brianna Decker (23-28=51) and Hilary Knight (29-21=50) for the honor. Martin, a senior from Stockholm, Sweden, had a WCHA-best 1.51 goals-against average, besting Minnesota's Noora Rätty (1.70 GAA).

Both Duggan and Rätty were named Patty Kazmaier Memorial Award nominees, announced on Monday by USA Hockey. The Patty Kazmaier Memorial Award is given annually to the top Division I women's hockey player and will be presented in conjunction with the 2011 NCAA Women's Frozen Four in Erie, Pa.

The list of 26 nominated players for the 2011 Patty Kazmaier Memorial Award includes 17 forwards, five goaltenders and four defensemen hailing from 12 different schools and all four NCAA Division I women's ice hockey leagues. Eight of the 26 nominees are from the WCHA, and in addition to Duggan and Rätty include Wisconsin's Decker and Knight, Minnesota Duluth's Haley Irwin and Jocelyne Larocque, and North Dakota's Jocelyne Lamoureux and Monique Lamoureux-Kolls.

Division 1 women's hockey coaches will select the top-10 finalists from among the group of 26 nominees, with the announcement taking place March 3. A 13-member selection committee will choose the three finalists (announced March 10), as well as the award recipient, which will be announced live at the brunch ceremony in Erie, Pa., on March 19. All NCAA Division I women's ice hockey head coaches were asked to nominate players for the award. New to the selection process in 2011 is the stipulation that a player had to be nominated by at least two coaches in order for her to make the official nomination list.

In the final games of the regular season on Feb. 18-19, Wisconsin scored 13 goals for the second-straight weekend as the Badgers swept host Minnesota State in the regular season finale. The UW earned a 4-0 shutout win last Friday and followed up with a 9-1 win last Saturday. Duggan and Decker led the Badgers with seven points each in the series. Duggan posted two goals and five assists, while Decker had three goals and four assists. Knight added six points on three goals and three assists, and Madison Packer had three goals on Saturday.

With seven points at Minnesota State last weekend, Duggan moved her career total to 224 points to become UW's all-time career points leader. She surpassed the mark of 218 points held by Sara Bauer. Duggan also became the first Badger all-time to reach both 100 career assists and 100 career goals when she scored her 100th career goal at Minnesota State (Feb. 19). Knight is currently riding an 18-game point streak, posting 42 points from Dec. 10-Feb. 19.

Minnesota Duluth ran its unbeaten streak to nine (8-0-1) games with two home-ice victories over St. Cloud State, 8-0 and 9-0. Outshooting the Huskies 104-38 in the series, the Bulldogs had 10 players notch at least one point and six that recorded two or more. Pernilla Winberg finished out last Friday's game with five points after scoring the first four goals of the game. Winberg's first career hat trick at UMD came between 10:45 and 18:51 of the opening period. Winberg then tacked on a fourth-consecutive goal in the second period. Kim Martin recorded her school record 66th win between the pipes in last Saturday's shutout.

In Grand Forks last weekend, Minnesota and host North Dakota traded 5-3 decisions before a series total of 6,043 fans. Golden Gopher Amanda Kessel had two goals in last Friday's Minnesota victory while UND's Lamoureux had four points in the series, including the tying goal Saturday as the Sioux added three third period goals in front of a school best 3,158 fans.

And in Bemidji, host Bemidji State took a 4-1 victory from Ohio State last Friday before the two teams tied 1-1 (ot) last Saturday. Natalie Spooner, who became only the second OSU player to ever score 20 goals in three straight years, had the only goal in the shootout to give the Buckeyes the extra point Saturday.

In this week's (Feb. 21) USCHO.com Div. 1 Women's College Hockey Poll, four of the WCHA's eight-member teams are again ranked in the top ten. In addition to Wisconsin at No. 1, Minnesota is tied with Mercyhurst for No. 3, Minnesota Duluth is ranked No. 6, and North Dakota is No. 8.

Through games of Feb. 22, the eight WCHA women's teams are a combined 24-11-3 in non-conference play this season for a .671 winning percentage.

WCHA Continues Shootouts; Adopts New Standings Format for League Play in 2010-11

The WCHA is continuing to use shootouts for the 2010-11 season and has also implemented a three-point system in women's league play. In a change this year the WCHA has adopted a standings format for league play where a team that wins in regulation or overtime receives three points, a team that wins a shootout is awarded two points, a team that loses a shootout gets one point, and a team that loses in regulation or overtime earns no points.

The standings show wins, losses, ties and shootout wins – W-L-T-SW (W-L-T add up to games played, the tie column signifies how many times a team has been to a shootout and the SW column represents how many shootouts a team has won.) Teams are awarded three points for each win in regulation or overtime, and one point for an overtime tie. Conference games tied after 65 minutes advance to a three-player shootout with the winning team receiving an extra point in the standings (denoted in the SW column).

2011 WCHA Playoffs, NCAA Tournament

The pursuit of the WCHA playoff championship will get underway the weekend of Friday-Sunday, Feb. 25-27 with four, first round conference playoff series. The top four ranked teams in the final regular season standings will all host best-of-three playoff series against the bottom four ranked teams. The No. 1 seed hosting the No. 8 seed, the No. 2 seed hosting the No. 7 seed, the No. 3 seed hosting the No. 6 seed, and the No. 4 seed hosting the No. 5 seed.

Those four first-round conference playoff winners will then advance to the 2011 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF, which is set for March 4-5.

The WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF will be contested at Ridder Arena in Minneapolis and hosted by the University of Minnesota, but with a new twist.

"We have opted to play the championship on Friday (March 4) and Saturday (March 5) this season and we anticipate that giving us an additional boost. And as always, the four participating teams that earn the trip to the FINAL FACE-OFF will put everything on the line to win the tournament and receive the Association's automatic bid into the NCAA tournament championship field."

There will be two semi-final matchups on Friday, with face-offs at 4:07 pm CT (No. 4 vs No. 1) and 7:07 pm CT (No. 3 vs No. 2). The championship contest will then be played at 7:07 pm CT on Saturday evening. Minnesota Duluth is the defending WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF champion.

Following the league playoff championship, four NCAA Div. 1 Women's Regional tournaments will be contested the weekend of March 11-14 at sites to be determined.

The four regional winners then earn a trip to the 2011 NCAA Women's Frozen Four, set for March 18 and 20 in Erie, Pa.

Eight WCHA Players Among Nominees for 2011 Patty Kazmaier Memorial Award

Twenty-Six Players Nominated for Top Honor in Women's College Hockey

COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo. – Twenty-six players are among the list of nominees for the 2011 Patty Kazmaier Memorial Award, presented by Lake Erie College of Osteopathic Medicine. An award of The USA Hockey Foundation, the Patty Kazmaier Memorial Award is annually bestowed upon the top player in NCAA Division 1 women's ice hockey.

Held in conjunction with the NCAA Women's Frozen Four, the 2011 Patty Kazmaier Memorial Award, presented by LECOM, will be given out at a brunch ceremony on March 19 at the Bayfront Convention Center in Erie, Pa.

The list of 26 nominated players includes 17 forwards, five goaltenders and four defensemen hailing from 12 different schools in all four NCAA

Division 1 women's leagues. Mercyhurst College, host of the 2011 NCAA Women's Frozen Four, leads all schools with five nominated players.

The 34 NCAA Division 1 women's ice hockey head coaches will select the top-10 finalists from among the group of 26 nominees, with the announcement taking place March 3. A 13-member selection committee will choose the three finalists (announced March 10), as well as the award recipient, which will be announced live at the brunch ceremony in Erie on March 19.

Mercyhurst College leads all schools with five nominees, while Cornell University has four; Boston University and the University of Wisconsin each have three; Boston College, the University of Minnesota Duluth and the University of North Dakota each have two; and the University of Minnesota, Niagara University, Quinnipiac University, Syracuse University and Yale University each have one ... Eight of the nominated players were also nominated in 2010, including last year's winner Vicki Bendus (Wasaga Beach, Ont./Mercyhurst College); top-three finalist Noora Rätty (Espoo, Finland/Univ. of Minnesota); top-10 finalists Bailey Bram (Ste. Meghan Agosta (Ruthven, Ont./Mercyhurst College) was a top-three finalist in 2007, 2008 and 2009 prior to taking the 2009-10 season off for the 2010 Olympics. Rebecca Johnston (Sudbury, Ont./Cornell Univ.), Hilary Knight (Sun Valley, Idaho/Univ. of Wisconsin), Monique Lamoureux-Kolls (Grand Forks, N.D./Univ. of North Dakota), Molly Schaus (Natick, Mass./Boston College) and Jenn Wakefield (Pickering, Ont./Boston Univ.) were all top-10 finalists in 2009 prior to taking the 2009-10 season off for the 2010 Olympics ... The award is named in honor of the late Patty Kazmaier, who was a four-year varsity letter-winner and All-Ivy League defenseman for Princeton University from 1981-86. An accomplished athlete who helped lead the Tigers to the Ivy League Championship in three consecutive seasons (1981-84), Patty Kazmaier-Sandt died on Feb. 15, 1990, at the age of 28, following a long struggle with a rare blood disease ... WCHA Announces Record Group of 90 Men's and Women's Scholar-Athletes for 2010-11 Sixth Annual Class Includes 30 Repeat Honorees

MADISON, Wis. – The Western Collegiate Hockey Association, through Commissioner Bruce M. McLeod, Associate Commissioner Sara R. Martin, University of Alaska Anchorage Faculty Representative Steve Strom (Chair, men's league) and University of North Dakota Faculty Representative Sue Jenö (Chair, women's league) today (Feb. 10, 2011) announced that a total of 90 men's and women's student-athletes make up the sixth annual group of WCHA Scholar-Athlete Award recipients. Over the first six years of the award, there have now been 414 honorees representing all 12 men's member and all eight women's member institutions. The previous record for honorees in one season was 80 in 2009-10.

The prestigious WCHA Scholar-Athlete Award was developed through Association member team Faculty Representatives and approved by the conference membership beginning with the 2005-06 season. To earn recognition as a WCHA Scholar-Athlete, conference-member student-athletes must have completed at least one year of residency at their present institution prior to the current academic year and must also have a grade-point average of at least 3.50 on a 4.0 scale for the previous two semesters or three quarters, or may qualify if his or her overall GPA is at least 3.50 for all terms at his or her present institution.

WCHA Member Team Weekly Notebooks

Bemidji State Beavers

- The Beavers (13-15-4 overall, 11-13-4-2 in WCHA) will travel to Grand Forks, N.D., this weekend to take on the fourth-seeded University of North Dakota. The best-of-three series begins on Friday and game times are set for 7:37 pm Friday and Saturday and 7:07 pm on Sunday, if necessary.
- This season the Beavers went 1-2-1 against the Sioux, going 1-0-1 at home taking five points from UND after winning a shootout. However, the two losses came as the Beavers were swept by the Sioux over the Jan. 15-16 weekend.
- Erin Cody, Emily Erickson and Annie Bauerfeld each have scored two goals against the Sioux this season, both of Bauerfeld's goals, including one scored shorthanded, came in the two losses.
- Over the Jan. 15-16 series, the Beavers struggled defensively and allowed a total of 11 goals in the two games, including four scored between Jocelyne Lamoureux and Monique Lamoureux-Kolls.
- The Beaver defense played well last weekend shutting down the 12th best offense in the nation as Ohio State entered the weekend averaging almost three goals a game. Bemidji State kept them to just one goal in each game. BSU's defense will look to do the same as North Dakota enters the weekend with the nation's ninth best offense, averaging 3.44 goals a game. North Dakota's defense enters the weekend averaging 2.91 goals against a game.
- The Beavers should look back at last Friday's 4-1 victory against Ohio State, as BSU's snapped an offensive drought, scoring four goals and putting 44 shots on net. Cody and Emily Erickson both registered a goal and an assist to help the Beavers snap a six-game losing streak and pick up a school-record 11 conference wins in a season. Cody set a school record by becoming the first player to record multiple seasons of at least 20 goals. BSU also had scoring from Abby Williams and Lauren Williams, with Abby recording the game-winner at the 10:53 mark of the first period. Defenseman-turned-forward Marlee Wheelhouse, Annie Bauerfeld and Sadie Lundquist all recorded one assist. Zuzana Tomcikova made 20 saves en route to her 12th win of the season.
- The Feb. 19 game saw the Beavers score their only goal of the game at the 7:30 mark of the first period on the power-play. Montana Vichorek took a shot from the point that was stopped by OSU's Steffes and Cody got a shot off from the rebound, but Steffes came up with the second save. However, in making the reaction save, Steffes surrendered a second rebound and Erickson was there to put it away for her 15th goal of the season. The Buckeyes would later score on a broken play in front of the BSU net at the 5:50 mark of the third period to even the score. The game would end in a tie and OSU would go on to win the shootout 1-0 in three rounds to take the extra conference standing point.
- Cody became the first player in school history to record multiple seasons of scoring at least 20 goals. Scoring at the 9:20 mark of the third period on Feb. 18 against Ohio State, Cody netted her 20th goal of the season, marking back-to-back seasons to put up 20 goals.
- The Beavers secured a sole fifth-place finish in the WCHA, the best in program history. Last season the Beavers finished tied for fifth in the WCHA. BSU has also finished fifth before in the WCHA, but never with an eight-team conference before.
- With the win and tie against Ohio State over the Feb. 18-19 weekend, the Beavers set the school record for the best home record in a single season, going 9-5-2 (.652). The record surpasses the 1999-2000 season when that year's squad finished with a 8-7-2 (.592) home record.
- Bemidji State is sixth in the nation for senior class scoring with 69 points. BSU's seniors, Cody, Erin Johnson and Annie Bauerfeld, have combined for 31 goals and 38 assists, averaging 2.16 points per game.
- The forward line of Cody, Sadie Lundquist, and Emily Erickson has scored 37 of the 58 goals this year and have tallied 33 of the 95 assists so far. Cody leads the three with 20 goals and 17 assists, while Erickson has 15 goals and 10 assists. Lundquist has six goals and 11 assists. When playing together the trio has accounted for 69 of the 153 total points on the season.

Minnesota Golden Gophers

- The No. 3 Golden Gophers (23-8-2 overall, 18-8-2-1 WCHA) tied for second in the WCHA and will hold the No. 3 seed for the WCHA playoffs.
- Minnesota hosts Ohio State at Ridder Arena. In a best-of-three series, Friday's game is at 6 p.m., while Saturday's game is at 5 p.m. and Sunday's is at 4 p.m. (if needed). If the Gophers win the series, they advance to the WCHA FINAL FACEOFF, March 4-5, also at Ridder Arena.
- Minnesota went 4-0-0 against Ohio State this season, including a 4-2 and an 8-1 series win back in January. The last time at Ridder, however, it took the overtime to earn a 2-1 win against OSU. Megan Bozek scored the overtime, game-winning goal for the win on Dec. 12.
- Minnesota closed out the regular season with a series split against No. 8 North Dakota last weekend. The Gophers earned a 5-3 win on Friday and fell 5-3 Saturday to UND. In last Friday's game, Minnesota was up 3-1 after the first period as the Gophers won, 5-3. Amanda Kessel had two goals, while Bozek, Terra Rasmussen and Sarah Davis each scored. In last Saturday's contest, Anne Schleper gave the Gophers a 1-0 lead, while Jen Schoullis scored twice, but the Gophers fell 5-3 in the regular season finale.
- Sophomore goaltender Noora Rätty has been named a Patty Kazmaier nominee, announced by USA Hockey. The Patty Kazmaier Memorial Award is given to the top Division I women's hockey player. Rätty is one of 26 players in contention for the award, which will be given out annually in conjunction with the 2011 Frozen Four in Erie, Pa. It is the second-straight year Rätty has been a Gopher nominee and later named a top-three finalist as a freshman.
- Sarah Erickson is within three points to establishing her 100th career point. The last Gopher to accomplish the feat was Emily West and Brittany Francis last year. If Erickson reaches the 100-point mark, she would be the 18th player in school history to crack 100. Minnesota's all-time leader in points is Gopher assistant coach Natalie Darwitz, with 246 career points in just 99 games played.

Minnesota Duluth Bulldogs

- The No. 6 Bulldogs (20-7-3 overall, 18-7-3 WCHA) head into the playoffs holding the nation's second-longest unbeaten streak at nine games (8-0-1).
- UMD earned its fourth-straight WCHA series sweep with 8-0 and 9-0 wins at AMSOIL Arena last weekend against St. Cloud State. Now 40-9-2 all-time against Huskies, the Bulldogs went 3-0-1 against SCSU this season, outscoring them 24-2.
- Outshooting the Huskies 104-38 in the series, the Bulldogs had 10 players notch at least a point, six that recorded two or more, and of course Pernilla Winberg, who finished out the game with five points after scoring the first four tallies of the game. Winberg's first UMD career hat trick – a natural hat-trick (three straight goals) at that – came between 10:45 and 18:51 of the opening period, and gave the Bulldogs a 3-0 lead into the first intermission. Winberg tacked on a fourth-consecutive goal at 4:15 of the second period, and from there, UMD rolled with four more goals from four different players. Sophomore Jennifer Harss got her seventh win of the season and Lana Steck played in the entire third period to help the Bulldogs earn the shutout.
- Last Saturday, 13 players got on the scoresheet, including eight with two or more points, and four with three or more, as UMD routed SCSU 9-0. Sophomore forward Audrey Cournoyer got her first hat trick and recorded the sixth by a Bulldog so far this season (and third against the Huskies). The game's physical tone in the third period led to a program-high of 55 penalty minutes against UMD, but the night belonged to senior goaltender Kim Martin. She earned her 15th career shutout and collected her record-setting 66th win. Martin stands as UMD's all-time winningest goaltender, with an overall record of 66-22-6, which also ranks her No. 4 all-time in WCHA history.

Weekly Team Notebooks con't

- With 13 players having grabbed a point in the 9-0 Saturday win, it marks the first time 12 or more players have recorded a point in a game since Feb. 7, 2009.
- By picking up the season's 10th shutout, UMD's current squad also ties a program record for 10 shutouts in a season, a mark that has been reached twice before, and more recently during the 2007-08 season.
- Senior forward Elin Holmlöv extended her scoring streak to 10 games with her six point weekend (2g, 4a), and has piled up nine goals and 10 assists for 19 points in those last 10 skates.
- Junior forward Haley Irwin, who has also been named a 2011 Patty Kazmaier Award nominee along with Jocelyne Larocque, registered five points (1g, 4a) in her first game back from injury since Jan. 28.
- UMD's two wins last weekend pushed the Bulldogs' overall record to 20-7-3 and their WCHA record to 18-7-3, and marks the 12th straight season UMD has secured at least 20 wins in a year.
- The Bulldogs will host Minnesota State this weekend at AMSOIL Arena in the first round of the WCHA Playoffs. UMD went 4-0 against the Mavericks during the regular season, outscoring MSU 21-2, and after allowing two early goals in the Oct. 16 contest, the Bulldogs held the Mavericks scoreless for the following 209:39 minutes, going 11 straight periods without giving up a goal to MSU. UMD is 42-4-2 all time against MSU, and is 15-2 in opening playoff conference play, failing to advance only once in program history – that was prior to the league's switch to the best-of-three format in 2006.

Minnesota State Mavericks

- The Mavericks (8-23-3 overall, 7-20-1-0 WCHA) are seeded seventh and will travel to Duluth, Minn., to face the second-seeded and fifth-rated Minnesota Duluth bulldogs (20-7-3 overall, 18-7-3-0 WCHA) for the first-round of the playoffs, a best-of-three series with the winner advancing to the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF. The two teams are slated to face-off Friday at 7:07 p.m. and Saturday at 7:07 p.m. at UMD's AMSOIL Arena. If the two teams split on Friday and Saturday they will meet Sunday at 7:07 p.m. to determine the winner.
- The Mavericks are 4-42-3 overall record against Minnesota Duluth with its most recent win coming last season when MSU scored the game-winner with :34 left. Minnesota State went 0-4-0 against UMD this season. MSU was swept on the road with a 5-2 loss on Oct. 16, a 6-0 loss on Oct. 17, then swept at home with a 7-0 loss on Feb. 4 and a 3-0 loss on Feb. 5. The two goals scored in Minnesota State's 5-2 loss gave the Mavericks a 2-0 lead after the first period and were scored by junior forward Emmi Leinonen (assisted by Junior Moira O'Connor and junior Jackie Otto) and freshman forward Kathleen Rogan (assisted by Lauren Zrust), both their first goals of the season.
- The Mavericks were swept by first-rated Wisconsin last weekend, dropping the first contest 4-0, then falling to the Badgers 9-1 on Saturday. The Mavericks finished their season series with the Badgers 0-4-0 this season. In the series opener, Wisconsin jumped out to 1-0 lead at 17:16 of the first when sophomore center Brianna Decker collected a rebound in front of the net from a shot from Meghan Duggan and beat MSU netminder Alli Altmann. The Badgers added three goals in the second period giving the Badgers the 4-0 win. The first by Decker who scored her second goal of the night at 3:37, the second by senior Anne Dronen at 11:00 and the third by Decker at 19:39. Wisconsin finished with 38 shots to Minnesota State's 14. The Mavericks went 0-for-4 on the power-play and the Badgers went 1-for-6. Altmann stopped 34 shots, while Wisconsin goaltender Alex Rigsby had 14 saves. In the series finale, the Mavericks dropped their final regular-season contest Saturday to Wisconsin, 9-1.
- Senior forward Lisa Edman, senior forward Nina Tikkinen and senior defenseman Amy Udvig were honored prior to last Saturday's game as they competed in the final regular-season game of their careers.
- Wisconsin and Minnesota State exchanged goals midway through the first period. Duggan put the Badgers up 1-0 at 11:11 of the first, followed by freshman forward Tracy McCann knotting things up at one each at 14:34 of the first. It was all Wisconsin after that, as the Badgers scored

three more in the first, three in the second and two more in the third, making the final, 9-1. Wisconsin was led by Hilary Knight who finished the game with three goals and two assists. MSU goaltender Alli Altmann finished the game with 24 saves in two periods, and Danielle Butters started the third and stopped eight shots. Wisconsin netminder Becca Ruegsegger picked up the win and had 10 saves. Wisconsin had 41 shots to Minnesota State's 11.

North Dakota Fighting Sioux

- The No. 8 Fighting Sioux (18-11-3 overall, 16-10-2-0 WCHA) will be hosting the first round of WCHA playoffs for the first time in program history this weekend. UND will be making Cliff Purper Arena home as the Ralph Engelstad Arena is full with UND men's hockey and the North Dakota high school state tournament.
- The Sioux will host Bemidji State and went 2-1-1 against the Beavers this season. The Sioux skated to a 2-1 loss and 1-1 tie in its first series in Bemidji, Minn. UND was without their top-two scorers in the series in Jocelyne Lamoureux and Monique Lamoureux-Kolls who were with USA Hockey. In both team's first conference games after the New Year, the Sioux swept the series 5-1 and 6-1 in its home games. The first game was played in Roseau, Minn.
- Alyssa Wiebe leads the Sioux with six points off three goals and three assists against BSU this season. Holly Perkins, Monique Lamoureux-Kolls and Jocelyne Lamoureux each have two goals playing in only two of the four games. Junior Stephanie Ney is 2-0-1 in the regular-season series with a 1.62 goals-against average and an .943 save percentage.
- The Sioux outscored the Beavers 13-7 in the four games and had a team +39 plus/minus.
- In front of their second and third largest crowds ever, the Sioux fell short in the series opener to rival Minnesota 5-3 last Friday and rebounded on senior night with a 5-3 win last Saturday. The Sioux had a program record 6,043 fans scan in for the series. Special teams was on full display both nights as the Gophers converted three power-plays to help lead them on Friday and again twice on Saturday. After going 1-for-7 in the opener, the Sioux rebounded to convert three times in its win.
- Jocelyne Lamoureux scored a remarkable goal that has had over 8,000 hits on Youtube.com last Friday. On a breakaway, she entered the zone to the left and cut to the right near the faceoff circle. Nearing the crease Lamoureux did a 270-degree spin-o-rama move to get Minnesota netminder Noora Raty sliding to her left and slid the puck into the wide-open net.
- After Minnesota jumped out to a 3-0 lead in the first period last Friday, the Sioux would pull to within one goal but a 5:00 major penalty doomed them as UM would score twice on the power-play to open a 5-2 lead. Last Saturday, it couldn't have been scripted any better for the home team as UND's lone senior Stephanie Roy scored the eventual game-winning goal in part of a Sioux four-goal third period on senior night. Minnesota again skated to a lead after the first period but this time the Sioux limited the Gophers to a 1-0 lead. Jocelyne Lamoureux would even the game in the second period and the Sioux would explode in the third period secure the win. The Sioux finished the season 3-1-0 against Minnesota.

Ohio State Buckeyes

- Buckeyes (14-17-3 overall, 8-17-3-3 WCHA) went 0-1-1-1 in a WCHA series at Bemidji State Feb. 18-19 to close out the regular season. In game one, the Buckeyes fell, 4-1, Friday, but tied, 1-1, in game two, which included a 1-0 shootout win over the Beavers. Ohio State leads the all-time series vs. the Beavers, 27-14-9.
- Ohio State went 7-10-1 at home and 7-7-2 on the road.
- The Scarlet and Gray are averaging 2.79 goals per game while allowing an average of 3.21.
- The Buckeye special teams are operating at 16.4% on the power-play (24-of-146) and 80.0% on the penalty-kill (100-of-125).
- Leading the Buckeyes in points and assists is Laura McIntosh, with 44 and 35, respectively.
- Natalie Spooner has scored a team-high 26 goals, including 10 on the

power-play, and has 39 points.

- Patrolling the OSU nets is freshman Lisa Steffes, who is 14-17-3 with a 3.09 GAA and a .906 save percentage.
- Spooner led the Buckeyes with two points, including a goal and an assist, in the series vs the Beavers. Spooner has recorded at least one point in the last five games. With 26 goals (team-high), Spooner is tied for fourth overall in the conference with 0.96 goals per game. Spooner is just the second Buckeye in program history to have at least 20 goals in three-consecutive seasons. In game two, Spooner tied the game, 1-1, at 6:50 in the third period with assists from Tarr and junior Melissa Feste. Following a scoreless overtime, Spooner posted the lone goal in the three-period shootout session to give the Buckeyes the extra point in WCHA play.
- Senior forward Jenna Kilpatrick scored her first goal of the season in game one at Bemidji State.
- Freshman forward Ally Tarr picked up an assist over the weekend and now has 14 points (7g, 7a) in her rookie campaign, which leads all Buckeye freshmen. She ranks eighth overall among WCHA freshmen in scoring this season.
- Steffes recorded 77 saves in the series vs. the Beavers to cap the 1,000-saves mark to conclude the regular season. Steffes, who holds the single-season program record for saves with 1,016 stoppers, is the only goalie in the nation to have at least 1,000 saves in 2011.
- Spooner leads Ohio State in scoring vs. the Beavers with 14 points (6g, 8a) in 12 games.
- Spooner finishes the regular season with the fifth-most goals in WCHA-only games with 17.
- Up next, No. 6-seed Ohio State travels to Minneapolis, Minn., to take on the No. 3-seed Minnesota Golden Gophers in a best-of-three series in the first round of the WCHA playoffs. Game one begins at 6 p.m. CT Friday, while game two starts at 5 p.m. CT. Game three (if necessary) is set for 4 p.m. CT Sunday. The Golden Gophers held a 4-0 advantage over the Buckeyes during the 2011 regular season.

St. Cloud State Huskies

- The Huskies (1-26-1-1 WCHA, 1-31-1 overall) played their last two games of the regular season and were swept by the #6-ranked Minnesota Duluth Bulldogs on Friday and Saturday, Feb. 18-19. SCSU played in the AMSOIL Arena for the first time in school history. UMD out-scored the Huskies 17-0 on the weekend.
- SCSU goaltenders Ashley Nixon and Tayler VanDenakker both saw action between the pipes. Nixon gave up all eight goals in Friday night's contest while VanDenakker surrendered nine goals to the Bulldogs on Saturday.
- SCSU now returns home for a week of practice before heading to No. 1-seeded University of Wisconsin on Friday-Sunday, Feb. 25-27, for the first round of the WCHA Playoffs in a best-of-three series. The games will be played at the Eagle's Nest in Verona, WI. The Badgers won all four of the meetings between the teams in the regular season.

Wisconsin Badgers

- The Badgers (30-2-2, 24-2-2-2 WCHA) host St. Cloud State (1-31-1, 1-26-1 WCHA) in the first round of the WCHA playoffs this weekend. The Badgers earned the No. 1 seed in the WCHA playoffs, while St. Cloud State is the No. 8 seed.
- The Badgers are on a 20-game unbeaten streak, posting an 18-0-2 record since losing to Minnesota Duluth on Nov. 28.
- Wisconsin scored 13 goals for the second-straight weekend as the Badgers swept Minnesota State in the regular season finale. UW earned a 4-0 shutout win last Friday and followed up with a 9-1 win Saturday.
- Meghan Duggan and Brianna Decker led Wisconsin with seven points each in the series. Duggan posted two goals and five assists, while Decker earned three goals and four assists over the weekend. Hilary Knight added six points on three goals and three assists, and Madison Packer had three goals on Saturday.
- The Badgers outshot the Mavericks, 79-25, in the series. UW scored three power-play goals and added two shorthanded tallies while limiting Minnesota State to 0-for-8 with the man-advantage. MSU mustered just five power-play shots in the two games.
- Looking ahead to this weekend, Wisconsin owns a 41-7-2 all-time record against St. Cloud State. The Badgers swept the Huskies twice this season, outscoring SCSU 27-1 in four games. Most recently, UW earned back-to-back shutouts over St. Cloud State with 10-0 and 6-0 wins at the Kohl Center Jan. 14-16. Wisconsin is 2-0-0 all-time against St. Cloud State in the postseason. The Badgers picked up a 3-1 win over SCSU in the quarterfinal round of the 2005 WCHA tournament and posted a 9-0 victory in the semifinals of the league tournament March 11, 2006. Both games took place at Ridder Arena.
- With seven points against Minnesota State last weekend, Duggan moved her career total to 224 points to become UW's all-time career points leader. She surpassed the mark of 218 points held by Sara Bauer. Duggan also became the first Badger all-time to reach both 100 career assists and 100 career goals when she scored her 100th career goal at Minnesota State (Feb. 19).
- Hilary Knight is currently riding an 18-game point streak, posting 42 points from Dec. 10-Feb. 19. Her streak ranks fifth among UW's longest individual point streaks all-time.
- Wisconsin's 9-1 win over Minnesota State (Feb. 19) marked the team's 30th win of the year and made 2010-11 UW's fourth 30-win campaign in program history. The Badgers also reached the 30-win mark in 2005-06 (36-4-1), 2006-07 (36-1-4) and 2008-09 (34-2-5).

WCHA Women's Tie-Breaking Procedures • For Playoff Seeding Purposes Only

At the conclusion of the regular season, teams will be ranked by the number of points accumulated. If two teams are tied for first place, they will be declared co-WCHA champions.

The first round of the WCHA's post-season tournament will be a best-of-three games format at the home site of the teams ranked higher in the final regular season standings. All eight teams participate in the first round of the tournament. First round playoff pairings will be: #1 rank vs #8 rank, #2 rank vs #7 rank, #3 vs #6, and #4 vs #5. Following the four first round series, the four winning teams will be re-seeded #1 thru #4 according to their standings in the final WCHA in-season competition and will advance to the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF.

In the event that ties are encountered in the determination of WCHA ranking or designation of home teams for playoff purposes, the following procedures will be used in the order given to break the ties:

- If two or more teams are tied, head-to-head competition during the regular (conference) season will be used to break the tie.
- If two or more teams are still tied after (a), the highest seed will go to the team with the most WCHA (conference) wins during the regular season.
- If two or more teams played a four-game series during the regular season and the teams have the same win-loss records for those series and the same number of WCHA wins, the team having the least number of goals scored against it in the four-game series shall have the higher rank. If two or more teams played a two-game series during the regular season, proceed to tie-breaker d).
- If two or more teams are still tied after applying the provisions of (a), (b) and (c), the team having the greatest "winning margin" during the regular season will have the higher rank. Winning margin = WCHA goals for during the regular season minus WCHA goals against.
- Games played against WCHA opponents in holiday tournaments will not be counted in the determinations.
- Shootout wins used during the regular season will not be counted in the determinations. Shootout games will be recorded as a tie in the determinations.
