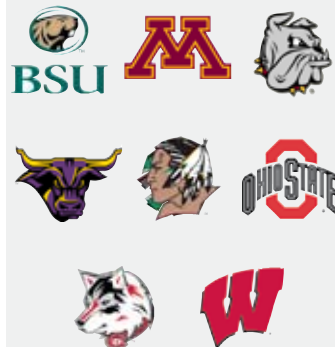

Wisconsin Clinches WCHA Regular Season Championship, Top Seed for League Tournament; Minnesota, North Dakota Earn Home Playoff Berths; WCHA Series for Feb. 11-13 Weekend Have UND at UW, BSU at UM, UMD at OSU, MSU at SCSU Badgers Win Third League Title, Extend Unbeaten Streak to 16 Games with Sweep at BSU; Golden Gophers, Sioux Earn Feb. 4-5 Sweeps to Secure Home Playoff Berths; Bulldogs Win Twice at MSU; WCHA's Non-Conference Record at 24-11-3 (.671); Four WCHA-Member Teams Again Ranked Among Nation's Top 10 in Latest USCHO.com Div. 1 Poll ... UW No. 1, UM No. 4, UMD No. 6, UND No. 8 ; Tickets Continue on Sale for 2011 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF, Set for March 4-5 at Ridder Arena in Minneapolis

MADISON, Wis. – It was a 'Super' weekend in the State of Wisconsin last weekend (Feb. 4-5) and it wasn't just because Green Bay won the NFL's Super Bowl. A few days earlier, the top-ranked University of Wisconsin women's hockey team clinched its third Western Collegiate Hockey Association regular season championship with two victories at Bemidji State and also ran their unbeaten streak to 16 games.

On that same weekend, Minnesota and North Dakota both secured home ice for the first round of WCHA playoffs with two-game series sweeps while defending national champion Minnesota Duluth pulled within two points of clinching a spot in the top four in the standings with back-to-back shutouts at Minnesota State.

Wisconsin's 7-1 road victory over Bemidji State last Friday clinched the Badgers' first WCHA regular-season title since they earned back-to-back conference crowns in 2006 and 2007. The UW clinched this year's league title with five games remaining in the regular season.

"The team got rewarded tonight by working hard for 60 minutes," said UW head coach Mark Johnson. "I think con't

everybody, in the back of their minds, knew that if we won tonight, we had clinched the WCHA title. They should be proud of their accomplishment. It's tough to win any kind of championship, and certainly the regular season is probably the most difficult because it takes the longest to earn.

"There are still things to play for," Johnson said of keeping focus after earning the league's regular season title. "You have the national rankings, you look at the opportunity to prepare yourself for the playoffs, and you look at the next step of hopefully hosting an NCAA regional game. Those things are huge."

On the weekend, nine players had multiple points for the Badgers, including senior forward Meghan Duggan who had her program-record point streak end at 25 games when she failed to score in the series finale at BSU and Hilary Knight, who scored her school best 100th career goal last Friday and then got the overtime game-winner to seal a 3-2 victory last Saturday. The Badgers are 14-0-2 in their unbeaten streak.

The Badgers (26-2-2, 20-2-2-2 WCHA) will get tested this weekend when No. 8-ranked and third place North Dakota (17-8-3, 15-7-2 WCHA) visits the Kohl Center in Madison for a Friday night, 7:07 pm CT face-off and a Sunday afternoon, 2:07 pm CT puck-drop on the penultimate weekend of the 2010-11 regular season. In their first series this season, Wisconsin swept host UND by scores of 4-3 and 6-2 on Dec. 4-5.

With four games left in the regular season, only the Badgers' top seed and St. Cloud State's No. 8 seed have been determined for the first round of league playoffs so this weekend's series are critical.

In Minneapolis, second place Minnesota (20-7-2, 15-7-2-1 WCHA) will play host to Bemidji State (12-13-3, 10-11-3-2 WCHA) at Ridder Arena, with game times at 6:07 pm CT on Friday and 4:07 pm CT on Saturday. The Gophers have clinched home ice for the first round while the Beavers are still in the hunt but face a tough task, standing 10 points behind UMD. Earlier this season, the two teams split in Bemidji, with BSU winning 2-0 on Dec. 3 and UM winning 6-2 on Dec. 4.

At the OSU Ice Rink in Columbus, Ohio State (14-14-2, 8-14-2-2 WCHA) will entertain Minnesota Duluth (16-7-3, 14-7-3 WCHA) at 7:07 pm ET on Friday evening and 4:07 pm CT on Saturday afternoon. This four-game season series is tied at 1-1 following a split in Duluth back on Nov. 19-20 that saw the Buckeyes claim a 4-2 triumph in game one before the Bulldogs blazed back with an 8-0 win in game two.

And at the National Hockey Center in St. Cloud, St. Cloud State (0-28-1, 0-23-1-1 WCHA) will host Minnesota State (7-20-3, 6-17-1 WCHA) at 7:07 pm CT on Friday night and 2:07 pm CT Saturday afternoon. The Mavericks are 2-0 vs the Huskies this season with 4-1 and 4-2 wins on Nov. 5-6 in Mankato.

Last weekend, Minnesota stayed hot (10-1-2 since losing to BSU in early December) and remained in second place with a sweep of St. Cloud State at Ridder Arena. Twelve different players produced points in the series and freshman forward Amanda Kessel completed a seven-point weekend with a goal and two assists on Saturday as the Gophers defeated St. Cloud State, 4-1. On Friday Kessel, whose brother Phil is a National Hockey League all-star with the Toronto Maple Leafs, had two goals and two assists.

Defending national champion Minnesota Duluth remained in fourth place with a pair of shutout victories on the road at Mankato. Senior defenseman Laura Fridfinnson scored a goal and added three assists

and senior goaltender Kim Martin made 23 saves to help UMD take a 7-0 shutout over Minnesota State last Friday while sophomore netminder Jennifer Harss earned her third shutout of the season with a 17-save performance in a 3-0 win last Saturday.

In Columbus, North Dakota earned a couple of exciting one-goal decisions over host Ohio State. Sophomore forward Monique Lamoureux-Kolls scored her second goal of the game with nine seconds left in overtime to lift the Sioux to a 4-3 road victory last Friday. In the series finale, junior forward Sara Dagenais, sophomore defenseman Jordan Slavin and senior forward Stephanie Roy each scored goals to help UND stay in third place and clinch a home playoff berth with a sweep of its series with a 3-2 victory on Saturday.

The WCHA standings show Wisconsin (26-2-2 overall, 20-2-2-2 in WCHA play) in first place and claiming the regular season crown with 64 points and Minnesota (20-7-2 overall, 17-7-2-1 WCHA) second with 48 points. North Dakota (17-8-3 overall, 15-7-2-0 WCHA) is in third place with 47 points, Minnesota Duluth (16-7-3 overall, 14-7-3-0 WCHA) is in fourth place with 45 points and Bemidji State (12-13-3 overall, 10-11-3-2 WCHA) is in fifth with 35 points. Ohio State (14-14-2 overall, 8-14-2-2 WCHA) is in sixth place with 28 points, Minnesota State (7-20-3 overall, 6-17-1-0 WCHA) is seventh with 19 points, and St. Cloud State (0-28-1 overall, 0-23-1-1 WCHA) is eighth with two points.

In this week's (Feb. 7) USCHO.com Div. 1 Women's Hockey Poll, four of the WCHA's eight teams are again ranked in the top 10. In addition to the Badgers at No. 1, Minnesota is No. 4. Minnesota Duluth is ranked No. 6 and North Dakota No. 8. Also receiving votes from the WCHA was Bemidji State.

Through games of Feb. 8, the eight WCHA women's teams are a combined 24-11-3 in non-conference play for a .671 winning percentage.

Looking ahead to the final weekend of the 2010-11 regular season – Friday, Feb. 18 and Saturday, Feb. 19 – there will be a full slate of four WCHA series played. Minnesota Duluth will host St. Cloud State, Bemidji State welcomes Ohio State, Wisconsin travels to Minnesota State, and Minnesota heads to North Dakota.

WCHA Continues Shootouts; Adopts New Standings Format for League Play in 2010-11

The WCHA is continuing to use shootouts for the 2010-11 season and has also implemented a three-point system in women's league play. In a change this year the WCHA has adopted a standings format for league play where a team that wins in regulation or overtime receives three points, a team that wins a shootout is awarded two points, a team that loses a shootout gets one point, and a team that loses in regulation or overtime earns no points.

The standings show wins, losses, ties and shootout wins – W-L-T-SW (W-L-T add up to games played, the tie column signifies how many times a team has been to a shootout and the SW column represents how many shootouts a team has won.) Teams are awarded three points for each win in regulation or overtime, and one point for an overtime tie. Conference games tied after 65 minutes advance to a three-player shootout with the

winning team receiving an extra point in the standings (denoted in the SW column).

2011 WCHA Playoffs, NCAA Tournament

The pursuit of the WCHA playoff championship will get underway the weekend of Friday-Sunday, Feb. 25-27 with four, first round conference playoff series. The top four ranked teams in the final regular season standings will all host best-of-three playoff series against the bottom four ranked teams. The No. 1 seed hosting the No. 8 seed, the No. 2 seed hosting the No. 7 seed, the No. 3 seed hosting the No. 6 seed, and the No. 4 seed hosting the No. 5 seed.

Those four first-round conference playoff winners will then advance to the 2011 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF, which is set for March 4-5.

The WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF will be contested at Ridder Arena in Minneapolis and hosted by the University of Minnesota, but with a new twist.

“We have opted to play the championship on Friday (March 4) and Saturday (March 5) this season and we anticipate that giving us an additional boost. And as always, the four participating teams that earn the trip to the FINAL FACE-OFF will put everything on the line to win the tournament and receive the Association’s automatic bid into the NCAA tournament championship field.”

There will be two semi-final matchups on Friday, with face-offs at 4:07 pm CT and 7:07 pm CT. The championship contest will then be played at 7:07 pm CT on Saturday evening. Minnesota Duluth is the defending WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF champion.

Following the league playoff championship, four NCAA Div. 1 Women’s Regional tournaments will be contested the weekend of March 11-14 at sites to be determined.

The four regional winners then earn a trip to the 2011 NCAA Women’s Frozen Four, set for March 18 and 20 in Erie, Pa.

- The Beavers (10-11-3-2 WCHA, 12-13-3 overall) will hit the road for the final time of the regular season this weekend as the Beavers head to Minneapolis to face-off against the No. 4 Minnesota Golden Gophers.

The Gophers have gone on a 10-1-2 run since losing to Bemidji State on Dec. 3.
- All time the Beavers are now 3-44-5 against Minnesota and the Dec. 3 win was the first time BSU had beaten the Gophers in Bemidji. The previous two wins, Jan. 7, 2006 and Feb. 9, 2007, happened at Ridder Arena in Minneapolis.
- With four games left in the regular season the Beavers are not mathematically eliminated from hosting the first-round of the WCHA playoffs, but one win or shootout win by Minnesota Duluth would eliminate any chance of home ice for the Beavers in the post-season. The Beavers could still finish anywhere in the conference from tied for third to sixth.
- Junior goaltender Zuzana Tomcikova will be rejoining the Bemidji State squad, returning from Turkey where she participated in the 2011 World University Winter Games with the Slovakian National Hockey team.
- The BSU women's hockey team dropped two games to Wisconsin last weekend, losing 7-1 and 3-2 in overtime. In last Friday's contest the top-ranked Badgers opened the first period jumping out to a 4-0 lead. In the final of minute in the opening frame the Beavers started to get some momentum rolling and found a goal at the 19:23 mark. Sadie Lundquist and Cody combined to help Abby Williams score her first goal as a BSU Beaver. Last Saturday saw the Beavers rebound and at the 5:42 mark of the first period Cody scored on the power-play to give BSU their first lead of the weekend. Montana Vichorek was credited with an assist along with goalie Alana McElhinney who started the game making 29 consecutive saves before conceding Wisconsin's first goal at the 15:02 of the second period. The Badgers would later score to take a 2-1 lead late in the third period, but BSU's Marlee Wheelhouse tied the game with her first goal of the season. The Beavers entered overtime for the fifth time in the season and had an unblemished 1-0-3 record in overtime games. However, UW's Hilary Knight scored halfway through the extra frame to complete the regular season sweep over the Beavers. McElhinney made a total of 77 saves on the weekend, the most of any goalie in the WCHA last weekend, including 23 saves in the second period alone in Saturday's contest.
- With the win over Minnesota State on Jan. 22 the Beavers tied their school record for most home wins in a season with eight. The 1999-2000 squad finished with a 8-7-2 record and with two home games left, this year's team could do now worse than finishing 8-7-1 which would still set the mark for the highest home-winning percentage in program history.
- Bemidji State is sixth in the nation for senior class scoring with 64 points. Seniors Cody, Erin Johnson and Bauerfeld have combined for 29 goals and 35 assists, averaging 2.29 points per game.
- The forward line of Cody, Sadie Lundquist, and Erickson has scored 36 of the 57 goals this year and have tallied 32 of the 95 assists so far. Cody leads the trio with 18 goals and 15 assists, Erickson has 13 goals and nine assists, and Lundquist has six goals and 10 assists. The threesome has accounted for 68 of the 152 total points on the season, but they did not play together against UW due to Erickson's injury.
- Tomcikova has made 525 saves so far this season. In 21 games she has recorded a .929 save percentage and a 1.99 goals-against average.
- So far this new year Bauerfeld has scored four goals and assisted on seven while Johnson has also scored four and assisted on seven.
- In league play, the Beavers are tied for first with a 90.0% penalty-kill. Spanning back to the Dec. 4 game against Minnesota, the Beavers have successfully killed 39 of the last 41 penalties.

- Also in conference games only, the Beavers are ranked sixth on the power-play having scored 15 goals on 88 opportunities (17.0%).
- Tomcikova became the fifth goalie in BSU history to record a point after picking up an assist against North Dakota on Nov. 12. Tomcikova is now tied all-time for most points recorded by a BSU goaltender. McElhinney picked up her first collegiate point last season when notching an assist on Jan. 29, 2010 at St. Cloud State. She recorded her second assist on Feb. 5 against No. 1 Wisconsin.

Minnesota Golden Gophers

- The No. 4 Golden Gophers (20-7-2 overall, 15-7-2-1 WCHA) earned a two-game sweep over St. Cloud State last weekend at Ridder Arena. Minnesota had goal-scoring from eight different individuals, while 12 recorded a point in the sweep. On the weekend, Amanda Kessel had seven points, followed by Sarah Erickson with four and four individuals with three points.
- With the Saturday win and a Bemidji State loss to Wisconsin, the Gophers clinched home ice for the first round of the WCHA playoffs. Minnesota is currently second in the conference standings with 48 points, followed by North Dakota in third (47), Minnesota Duluth (45) and Bemidji State (35). Wisconsin won the WCHA regular season championship last night and currently have 64 conference points to clinch the No. 1 seed.
- The Gopher win also marked another 20-win season for Minnesota. The Golden Gophers have had a 20-plus win season since it became a varsity program in 1997-98.
- The Gophers earned a 4-1 win last Saturday to clinch WCHA first round home ice. After a scoreless first period, three goals were scored in the second as Minnesota went up, 2-1. Kessel scored the game's first goal when she netted a power-play goal at 10:38 in the second period. St. Cloud State scored its first goal of the weekend at 13:24 in the second period from Mollie Mott. Minnesota responded with a goal at 19:37 in the second to put the Gophers up, 2-1 after two as Becky Kortum knocked in a rebound attempt. Jen Schoullis cushioned the lead at 2:52 in the third. Minnesota was called with a penalty at 14:01 and St. Cloud State called timeout. Out of the break, SCSU pulled goalie Ashley Nixon to add the extra power-play attacker. Minnesota returned its player to the ice as SCSU still had the goalie pulled. At 19:49, Kessel set up Ashley Stenerson for her first career goal as a Golden Gopher with the empty netter and a 4-1 final.
- Minnesota opened the series last weekend with an 8-0 shutout over SCSU. Minnesota jumped out to a 2-0 lead after one when Erickson and Kessel each scored an unassisted goal. The Gopher opened the floodgates with five goals in the second period to put the game at 7-0 after two. Schoullis netted a goal of her own just :38 seconds into the second stanza to put the game at 3-0. Minnesota then lit the lamp again at 4:46, 8:25, 8:54 and 10:39 of the second period. Mira Jalosuo scored a Gopher power-play goal at 7:29 in the third period when she capitalized on a rebound attempt from Kessel and Anne Schleper. Both of the starting goalies left the game during the second period. Gopher goalie Noora Raty left after Minnesota's fourth goal scored, while Nixon departed after Kessel's second goal of the game. Raty was replaced by Jenny Lura. She continued the shutout with 17 saves, including nine in the third period. Raty earns the win, but both goalies assist in the shutout. Tayler VanDenakker replaced Nixon and had 21 saves in 31 minutes played.
- Bemidji State comes to town this weekend as the Golden Gophers close out their regular home season, Feb. 11-12. Friday's BSU game is slated for a 6 p.m. start, while Saturday's tilt will be at 4 p.m. The Saturday game will also feature an on-ice senior presentation prior to the game as the Gophers honor Lura, Laura May and Terra Rasmussen.

Minnesota Duluth Bulldogs

- The No. 6 Bulldogs (16-7-3 overall, 14-7-3 WCHA) got shutouts from each of their goaltenders and blanked Minnesota State 7-0 and 3-0 at Mankato on Feb. 4-5.
- UMD will take a four-game winning streak to Ohio State for its final road trip of the regular season Friday night and Saturday afternoon.
- Last Friday, 11 players notched a point in the 7-0 whitewash at MSU, including seven different goal scorers. Rookie forward Brienna Gillanders scored a power-play goal – and the eventual game-winner – 6:10 into the opening period, and the Bulldogs never looked back. Senior forward Laura Fridfinnson and sophomore Jessica Wong scored first period goals, while Jamie Kenyon added the fourth goal at 19:17 mark of the second period to push UMD's lead to 4-0. Mariia Posa netted her first goal of the season at 4:51 of the third period, and Audrey Cournoyer and Elin Holmlov added a goal each to bring the final offensive outburst to seven goals strong. Fridfinnson extended her current scoring to five games, and added three helpers while Holmlov pitched in a two assists along with her tally for three points, and three other Bulldog players picked up two points on the night. UMD goaltender Kim Martin – who is a single win away from tying the Bulldog career mark for goaltender wins with 64 – made 23 saves en route to her 11th victory of the season, and is 11-5-0 in 16 games played.
- Last Saturday, the Bulldogs, playing their fourth-straight game without injured leading scorer Haley Irwin, scored a goal in each period. Rookie Dana Gallop scored the first goal of her UMD career a minute into action. Cournoyer gave the Bulldogs a 2-0 lead 5:43 into the second stanza, and also gave Kenyon her second assist on the afternoon. Fridfinnson rounded out the balanced scoring attack at the early 3:10 mark of the third period. Sophomore netminder Jennifer Harsz picked up the win – her fifth win on the season, turning away all 17 shots she faced. UMD outshot the Mavericks 48-17.
- Fridfinnson led the No. 6 Bulldogs in scoring last weekend, tallying six points. She had a goal and three assists last Friday, scoring the second goal of the game at 9:20 in the first period, and adding an assist in the second period and two in the third. Last Saturday, Fridfinnson figured in two of UMD's three goals and was +3, leaving her +7 in the series. Fridfinnson has been on an offensive outburst since Jan. 21, registering 11 points (5g, 6a in her last six games).
- Kenyon extended her current scoring streak to four games after recording four points, including a goal and an assist in last Friday night's 7-0 win. She added two more assists in Saturday's victory, including the first two scores of the game. Over her last four games, the freshman forward has two goals and five assists for seven points.
- UMD is averaging 3.62 goals a game and have not been scored upon in the last 123 minutes of action.
- The Bulldogs continue on the road this weekend when they travel to Ohio State University to face the Buckeyes. Game-times are set for 7:07 p.m. Friday night and 4:07 p.m. Saturday. Both times are EST.

Minnesota State Mavericks

- The Mavericks (7-19-3 overall, 6-16-1-0 WCHA) will travel to St. Cloud for MSU's final WCHA road series with St. Cloud State at the National Hockey Center, Friday at 7:07 p.m. and Saturday at 2:07 p.m.
- Last weekend the Mavericks were swept by Minnesota Duluth, MSU's eighth sweep of the season. Last Friday's final was 7-0 and Saturday's final was 3-0.
- Last Friday's loss was the largest deficit since the 2008-09 season when MSU lost by eight goals twice. It was the first home series MSU was held scoreless since 12/7-12/8 against Minnesota. MSU has been held scoreless in two weekends this year, this past weekend against Minnesota Duluth and earlier this season at Wayne State. Minnesota State's two scoreless weekends marks the first time since the 2004-05 season it has occurred.
- Freshman goaltender Danielle Butters started last Friday's game and

suffered her fourth loss of the season, allowed a career-high seven goals and tallied 30 saves. The Bulldogs jumped out to a 3-0 lead after the first period. Freshman center Brienna Gillanders opened the scoring with a power-play goal at the 6:10 mark. Senior Laura Fridfinnson (9:20) and Jessica Wong (12:05) each scored even-strength tallies to close out the first frame. UMD tallied only one goal in the second period, by freshman Jamie Kenyon at 19:17, and added three more in the third courtesy of sophomore Mariia Posa (4:51), sophomore Audrey Cournoyer (14:07) and senior Elin Holmlov (14:41). UMD finished with 37 shots to MSU's 23, while the Bulldogs 1-for-2 on the power-play and Minnesota State went 0-for-4 with an extra skater.

- Junior goaltender Alli Altmann started last Saturday's game and suffered her 16th loss of the season, allowed three goal, but finished with a season-high 45 saves. UMD used a balanced scoring attack to down the Mavericks, tallying a goal in each period. Freshman forward Dana Gallop tallied the first period goal at 1:00, Cournoyer scored in the second at 5:43 and Fridfinnson scored the game final goal in the third period at the 3:10 mark. Minnesota Duluth had 48 shots to MSU's 17. Neither team capitalized with an extra skater, with MSU going 0-for-4 and UMD going 0-for-5.

North Dakota Fighting Sioux

- The No. 8 Fighting Sioux (17-8-3 overall, 15-7-2-0 WCHA) swept Ohio State in Columbus for the first time in program history last weekend improving to 17-8-3 and 15-7-2-0 in the WCHA.
- With the two wins by UND and two losses by BSU, the Sioux officially clinched home ice in the first round of the WCHA post-season for the first time ever. They will host either Bemidji State, Minnesota State or Ohio State on Feb. 25-27 in Grand Forks. Because of conflicts at the Ralph Engelstad Arena, the series will be played at Purper Arena.
- In the four games played between the Sioux and OSU, all were decided by one goal and three went to overtime. UND would finish with a 3-0-1 record in those games losing the only shootout.
- In last Friday's 4-3 win, Alyssa Wiebe scored the game-tying goal with just over a minute left and Monique Lamoureux-Kolls tallied the game-winner by scoring with nine seconds left in overtime. Lamoureux-Kolls sent a shot from just inside the blue line, near her own bench that went off of the far post and in. She had two goals and two assists while her twin sister, Jocelyne Lamoureux, added a goal and two assists.
- With its 3-2 win last Saturday, the Sioux broke the program record for victories in a season with 17. The previous record was 16 set in 2003-04, prior to the team joining the WCHA. The Sioux also won its seventh and eighth road games of the season which broke the previous record of six which happened in both 2003-04 and 2009-10. Forwards Stephanie Roy and Sara Dagenais and defenseman Jordan Slavin scored for UND. Roy scored the game-winner that clinched home-ice for the first time in program history. Fittingly, she was head coach Brian Idalski's first recruit to commit to UND. Slavin also broke the program record for single-season scoring by a defenseman with 22 points.
- Goaltender Stephanie Ney improved to 13-3-2 on the season by stopping 69 of 74 shots last weekend.
- Lamoureux improved her point-scoring streak to 11 games, a career high, during which she has scored 10 goals and 16 assists (2.25 per game).
- UND heads back on the road to take on top-ranked Wisconsin before returning home to close the regular season against No. 4 Minnesota.

Ohio State Buckeyes

- The Buckeyes (14-14-2 overall, 8-14-2-2 WCHA) lost two close games in a WCHA home series vs. No. 8 North Dakota Feb. 4-5 at the OSU Ice Rink in Columbus, Ohio. The Fighting Sioux won the first game 4-3 with nine seconds left in overtime Friday and followed with a 3-2 win Saturday against the Buckeyes. The Buckeyes lead the all-time series vs. the Fighting Sioux, 17-8-3. All four games vs. North Dakota this season went into overtime.
- The Scarlet and Gray are averaging 3.00 goals per game while allowing

an average of 3.13.

- The Buckeye special teams are operating at 18.0% on the power-play (23-of-128) and 82.0% on the penalty-kill (91-of-111).
- Leading the Buckeyes in points and assists Laura McIntosh, with 44 and 33, respectively.
- Natalie Spooner has scored a team-high 24 goals, including 10 on the power play, and has 35 points.
- Patrolling the OSU net is freshman Lisa Steffes, who is 14-14-2 with a 3.01 GAA and a .907 save percentage.
- McIntosh led the Buckeyes with three points on a goal and two assists in the series vs. the Fighting Sioux. McIntosh has recorded at least on assist in the last five games. With 33 assists (team-high), McIntosh is first in the conference with 1.22 assists per game. In game one, McIntosh tallied her 13th multi-point performance, recoding an assist and a goal. She added another assist in game two vs. UND.
- In game two vs UND last Saturday, Paige Semenza picked up her second multi-point performance of 2011 with a goal and an assist. Semenza has four goals and seven points overall in the first five series of 2011. She had five points in the first 18 games of the season.
- Kelly Wild recorded a goal and an assist in the series vs. the Fighting Sioux. She is fifth on the team in scoring with 18 points in 2011 and third in assist with 15 helpers this year.
- Senior defenseman Shannon Reilly continued her offensive success last weekend with an assist in game one vs. UND. With 22 points this year, Reilly is tied for first in the WCHA overall for defenseman scoring.
- In game one, the Buckeyes rallied to take a 3-2 lead after the Fighting Sioux jumped out to an early 2-0 advantage. - McIntosh now has 14 points (4 g, 9a) in 12 games vs. the Fighting Sioux, leading all active Buckeyes.
- Lisa Steffes surpassed the 850-save total in the series and now has 875 in her rookie season. She is the one goalie in the nation to stop more than 850 shots this year. Steffes stopped 33 shots last Friday and 28 Saturday for a total of 61 against the Fighting Sioux.
- Up next, Ohio State completes the home schedule, hosting Minnesota Duluth in a WCHA series Feb. 11-12. Games begin at 7 p.m. Friday and 4 p.m. Saturday at the OSU Ice Rink and admission, as always, is free. The Buckeyes defeated the Bulldogs, 4-2, in game one at Minnesota Duluth Nov. 19 before falling, 8-0, to the Bulldogs in game two Nov. 20.

St. Cloud State Huskies

- The Huskies (0-23-1-1 WCHA, 0-28-1 overall) dropped a pair of games at Minnesota last weekend.
- Rookie forward Mollie Mott garnered her fourth career goal in a 4-1 loss against the No. 4/5-ranked Minnesota Gophers on Saturday, Feb. 5, at Ridder Arena. The Gophers blanked the Huskies the night prior (Feb. 4) by a score of 8-0 to earn the league sweep. The sweep marked Minnesota's 21st sweep over the Huskies in school history.
- Mott's goal against the Gophers snapped the Huskies scoreless streak against Minnesota this season. Minnesota out-scored the Huskies 20-1 in four league games in 2010-11.
- Senior goalie Ashley Nixon backstopped the Huskies with 58 saves in the series against Minnesota.
- Tayler VanDenakker made an appearance in last Friday night's game, posting 21 saves in 31:06 minutes of ice time.
- Minnesota continues to dominate the all-time series with St. Cloud State, going 45-3-2, dating back to Jan. 9, 1999.
- Haylea Schmid, a sophomore forward, dished out the lone helper on SCSU's score last Saturday afternoon.
- The Huskies return home to host the Minnesota State, Mankato

- St. Cloud State's four seniors (Diana Karouzos, Courtney Josefson, Alecia Anderson and Nixon) will be honored for Senior Day before the contest on Saturday (Feb. 12).
- Earlier this season, Minnesota State swept the Huskies by scores of 4-1 and 4-2 on Nov. 5-6 in All Seasons Arena. MSU now holds a slight advantage in the all-time series over SCSU, 24-22-5, dating back to Nov. 21, 1998.
- Nixon continues to climb the all-time saves chart at St. Cloud State with 2849 total saves in net. She trails former Husky Laura Gieselmann (1999-03) by 228 saves. Gieselmann holds the school record with 3077 saves.

Wisconsin Badgers

- The Badgers (24-2-2, 18-2-2-2 WCHA) host their final regular-season series of the year at the Kohl Center this weekend. The Badgers host No. 8 North Dakota (17-8-3, 15-7-2-0 WCHA) Friday at 7 p.m. and conclude the series Sunday at 2 p.m.
- Wisconsin and North Dakota have met in 30 women's hockey games, and the Badgers own a 28-2-0 all-time record. UW picked up a road sweep at North Dakota Dec. 4-5, winning 4-3 and 6-2. - The goaltending duo of sophomore Becca Ruegsegger and freshman Alex Rigsby combined for two wins on the weekend. Ruegsegger made 27 saves in last Friday's win before Rigsby stopped 17 shots in Saturday's overtime victory. Wisconsin outshot BSU 87-47 in the series.
- Wisconsin's win over Bemidji State last Friday clinched the Badgers' third WCHA regular-season title. The Badgers earned back-to-back conference crowns in 2006 and 2007. UW clinched this year's league title with five games remaining in the regular season.
- Hilary Knight netted her 100th career goal against Bemidji State on Friday, becoming the first Badger to reach 100 career goals. She became Wisconsin's career leader for goals when she scored her 90th tally against Ohio State Jan. 8.
- With the sweep of Bemidji State, Wisconsin extends its unbeaten streak to 16 games at 14-0-2. The Badgers' current streak is the program's longest since opening the 2008-09 season with a 20-game unbeaten streak (18-0-2).
- Rigsby moved her individual unbeaten streak to 12 games at 10-0-2 with a win over BSU.
- Two Badgers are currently riding multi-game point streaks as well. Knight is on a 14-game streak and Haverstock has a three-game streak going.

WCHA Women's Tie-Breaking Procedures • For Playoff Seeding Purposes Only

At the conclusion of the regular season, teams will be ranked by the number of points accumulated. If two teams are tied for first place, they will be declared co-WCHA champions.

The first round of the WCHA's post-season tournament will be a best-of-three games format at the home site of the teams ranked higher in the final regular season standings. All eight teams participate in the first round of the tournament. First round playoff pairings will be: #1 rank vs #8 rank, #2 rank vs #7 rank, #3 vs #6, and #4 vs #5.

Following the four first round series, the four winning teams will be re-seeded #1 thru #4 according to their standings in the final WCHA in-season competition and will advance to the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF.

In the event that ties are encountered in the determination of WCHA ranking or designation of home teams for playoff purposes, the following procedures will be used in the order given to break the ties:

- If two or more teams are tied, head-to-head competition during the regular (conference) season will be used to break the tie.
- If two or more teams are still tied after (a), the highest seed will go to the team with the most WCHA (conference) wins during the regular season.
- If two or more teams played a four-game series during the regular season and the teams have the same win-loss records for those series and the same number of WCHA wins, the team having the least number of goals scored against it in the four-game series shall have the higher rank. If two or more teams played a two-game series during the regular season, proceed to tie-breaker d).
- If two or more teams are still tied after applying the provisions of (a), (b) and (c), the team having the greatest "winning margin" during the regular season will have the higher rank. Winning margin = WCHA goals for during the regular season minus WCHA goals against.
- Games played against WCHA opponents in holiday tournaments will not be counted in the determinations.
- Shootout wins used during the WCHA regular season will not be counted in the determinations. Shootout games will be recorded as a tie in the determinations.
